Our program on July 3rd was presented by Tara Laxer, the Director of Development for AVDA.

Aid to Victims of Domestic Abuse, Inc. (AVDA) offers life-saving services while promoting violence-free, equitable relationships and creating the social changes necessary to end domestic and dating violence. They are dedicated to empowering and supporting survivors of domestic violence to live violence-free and selfsufficient lives.

Domestic violence (DV), also called intimate partner violence, is a pattern of abusive behavior perpetrated by one intimate partner against another. The abuse can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic, digital or sufficient lives. For more information psychological. This includes any behaviors that frighten, intimidate, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, blame, injure, or wound someone. The one

constant component of DV is one partner's consistent efforts to maintain power and control over the other. DV can happen to anyone of any race, age,



sexual orientation, religion, gender, socioeconomic backgrounds, and education levels.

AVDA provides a Community of Hope through our state-certified domestic violence center that offers a comprehensive array of services for all victims of domestic violence including; a 24 hour crisis hotline, emergency and transitional housing, advocacy, counseling and support to help them live violence-free and selfgo to www.avdaonline.org.

Children, Inc. is a nonprofit organization, transforming Florida one student at a time. Working in every county throughout Florida, Take Stock in Children Palm Beach is 1 of 46 affiliate offices. Their mission is to break the cycle of poverty for low-income, academically aualified students by providing opportunities for a post-secondary education. Through an innovative multi-year model they provide wraparound services to students, with no drop-off of services after high school completion. Students are matched with a caring volunteer mentor, equipped with academically

focused intervention, awarded a college scholarship, and provided with post-secondary retention services.

A mentor is a caring, compassionate adult who chooses to devote their time to a young person. Mentors offer support, guidance, and encouragement. We're In This Together

Our program on July 31st was presented by Katherine Murphy, the CEO of Nami, Palm Beach County. National Alliance on Mental Illness Palm Beach County (NAMI PBC) is a nonprofit, volunteer-run organization dedicated to providing education, support and advocacy, with the goal to empower individuals living w



empower individuals living with mental illness and their families, and to eliminate the associated stigma.

One in 5 American adults experiences some form of mental illness in any given year. And across the population, 1 in every 20 adults is living with a serious mental health condition such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder or long-term recurring major depression.

As with other serious illnesses, mental illness is not your fault or that of the people around you, but widespread misunderstandings about mental illness remain. Many people don't seek treatment or remain unaware that their symptoms could be connected to a mental health condition. People may expect a person with serious mental illness to look visibly different from others, and they may tell someone who doesn't "look ill" to "get over it" through willpower. These misperceptions add to the challenges of living with a mental health condition.

Every year people overcome the challenges of mental illness to do the things they enjoy. Through developing and following a treatment plan, you can dramatically reduce many of your symptoms. People with mental health conditions can and do pursue higher education, succeed in their careers, make friends and have relationships. Mental illness can slow us down, but we don't need to let it stop us.

If you or someone you know is struggling, you are not alone. There are many supports, services and treatment options that may help. A change in behavior or mood may be the early warning signs of a mental health condition and should never be ignored. For more information, go to www.namipbc.org.



1775, Gen. George Washington took command of the Continental Army at Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Humorist Dave Barry is 77. Talk show host Montel Williams is 68. Actor Tom Cruise is 62. Actor Connie Nielsen is 59. WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange is 53. Actor Patrick Wilson is 51.

<u>July 10:</u>

1890, Wyoming was admitted as the 44th US state.

1925, jury selection took place in Dayton, Tennessee, in the trial of John T. Scopes, charged with violating the law by teaching Darwin's Theory of Evolution. (Scopes was convicted and fined, but the verdict was overturned on a technicality.)

1929, American paper currency was reduced in size as the government began

issuing bills that were approximately 25 percent smaller. 1940, during World War II, the Battle of Britain began as the German Luftwaffe launched attacks on southern England. (The Royal Air Force was ultimately victorious.)

1962, the first active communications satellite, Telstar 1, was launched by NASA. 1991, Boris N. Yeltsin took the oath of office as the first elected president of the Russian republic.

2002, the House approved, 310-113, a measure to allow airline pilots to carry guns in the cockpit to defend their planes against terrorists.

2015, South Carolina pulled the Confederate flag from its place of honor at the Statehouse after more than 50 years.


This Month's Sudoku Puzzle....

Gold - Kiwanis Club of Providence-Montego Bay – Eastern Canada and the Caribbean District Breast Cancer Awareness 5K Run/Walk/Wheelchair For 14 years, the Kiwanis Club of Providence-Montego Bay has held its Breast Cancer Awareness 5K Run/Walk — and last year, the club added a wheelchair segment to allow Aktion Clubs and community members with disabilities to take part. The event doesn't just raise awareness; it also raises funds for the Jamaica Cancer Society, the Oncology Ward of the Cornwall Regional Hospital, individuals in need of financial support for their cancer treatment and recovery, and other community projects. Kiwanians, community partners and over 200 Key Club and Circle K International members worked together to make a memorable event for over 2,500 attendees.

Silver - Kiwanis Club of Stuart – Florida District Kiwanis Park at Woodlawn

When members of the Kiwanis Club of Stuart built the first two playgrounds for Kiwanis Park at Woodlawn in 1990, they had no idea what a landmark the park would become for its community. Situated at the entrance to the city near a lowincome neighborhood, several daycare centers and the Creek Arts District, the park opened the county's first accessible playground in 2015 and its only sensory playground in 2021. Each of four playground areas has its own Little Free Library stocked by Kiwanians. Park-goers can also enjoy free Wi-Fi, a concession stand and donated art fixtures. Club events have become so popular that the park is now its main source of fundraising. In fact, most of the funds for the last round of park renovations came from the park itself.

Kiwanis Cares for Kids (KCK)

The Kiwanis Club of Gig Harbor works closely with the 17 schools of the Peninsula School District on its Kiwanis Cares for Kids (KCK) program. What started as a project to provide new clothes and shoes for kids in need has grown into one that facilitates experiences that help kids grow. Throughout the year, the club continues to raise funds for clothes and shoes but also for field trips, books, flexible classroom seating and extracurricular activities such as sports, music and camp. KCK enhances the self-esteem, education and life experiences of students from preschool through the post-high school transition program for adults with special needs.
