Fall 2024 Police Appreciation

Our Fall 2024 Police Appreciation awards took place on September 25th at the Delray Beach Golf Club. We recognized CSI Courtney Mezzancello and Officer Luis Bonet. **Employee Award:** In reviewing the procedures for public record requests, it was determined that the Crime Scene Unit was retaining items such as fingerprint cards, latent print cards, and Crime Scene photographs for extended periods of time unnecessarily.

When the statute of limitations for these cases ended, they were still being retained. There were over six full filing cabinets filled with these items and many terabytes of photographs that needed to be gone through and disposed of. Retaining these items caused the Police Department to not be compliant

regarding the public record retention law.

Crime Scene Investigator Courtney Mezzancello volunteered on her own to start going through all of these items and pull the cards/pictures that were overdue to be discarded. A lot of cases were old dating back to the early 1980's. CSI Mezzancello went through the latent print envelopes and set aside all major cases and sexual batteries and submitted them into evidence. Thousands of the remaining ones that were not of value any longer were destroyed as per the current

policy. This was an arduous task as it required that the statute of limitations be checked for every single case and determination made if they were going to be retained or destroyed. Clearing of these file cabinets will

create space for equipment that is currently stored in the Crime Scene Garage.

CSI Mezzancello also volunteered to mentor a Crime Scene Intern for a summer semester at the same time. Not only is CSI Mezzancello performing her normal duties and handling her caseload. but she is now spearheading a huge project and at the same time taking the time to teach an intern all the different processes needed to be a Crime Scene Investigator. Her positive attitude and contributions have had a profound impact on our unit and Police Department and continues to make CSI Mezzancello a valuable asset.

Officer Award: Officer Luis Bonet, through excellent and diligent investigative leads, was able to identify a suspect who was selling narcotics. Based on the information gathered during the course of his investigation, Officer Bonet was able to obtain a residential search warrant and on June 14, 2024 the warrant was executed. During the initial search of the residence, a large bag of marijuana was located in the target's bedroom. Directly near the marijuana was a large amount of currency and over 100 small clear zip top baggies. Also located inside the target's bedroom were numerous firearm cases. It should be noted that this was all within plain view of officers even though not included in the original residential search warrant. Also located was a budding marijuana plant in the backyard.

Following the location of the above-mentioned items, Officer Bonet conducted an in-depth interview with the target. Post-Miranda during the execution of the residential search warrant, the target admitted to ownership of all the aforementioned items that were located and stated that he was the occupant of the room where the items were found. The target stated that there were 7 firearms that were in his room, and they were all his.

Through Officer Bonet's knowledge, and experience, and due to prior investigation, it was determined that the target was selling narcotics, and due to this, a secondary search warrant was applied for and granted while still holding the residence. The amended search warrant included the seizure of narcotics, narcotic paraphernalia, currency, and firearms/firearm accessories.

After the secondary residential search warrant was signed the following was located and seized through the course of Officer Bonet's investigation: 30.3 Grams of Oxycodone, 12 Grams of MOMA, 575.4 Grams of Substituted Cathinone (Bath Salts), 257 Grams of Marijuana, 10 Firearms and \$13,363.00 in US Currency. Based on Officer Bonet's excellent investigative skills, hard work, and relentless effort, the target was arrested and charged for Armed Trafficking of the drugs mentioned with Intent to Sell.

In addition to his regular duties, Officer Bonet is also involved with the Criminal Justice Academy at Carver Middle School, which now has grown to three classes with over 50 students. Working with several other officers, they developed the curriculum, including instructional methods, assessment tools and weekly lesson plans, all while being assigned to other units.

Thank you CSI Mezzancello and Officer Bonet for your commitment to your profession, the Delray Beach Police Department and the public you serve.

Woodward Speaks To Our Club

On September 4th, Palm Beach County Commissioner Marci Woodward gave us an update on the pressing issues affecting South Palm Beach County. She is currently the District 4 Commissioner, covering Delray Beach, Boynton Beach and Boca Raton.



The issues included updates on Palm Beach International Airport, Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control, transportation matters, workforce affordable housing, and information about the updated FEMA flood zone maps.

FEMA's updated flood zone maps are effective Dec. 20, 2024, adding thousands of Palm Beach County residents to high-risk flood zones. Property owners can check to see if they're affected on the Palm Beach County Planning, Zoning & Building Department website (link below); if you're affected, you're encouraged to take any needed steps, including obtaining flood insurance if necessary, as soon as possible.

Delray Clean up Day

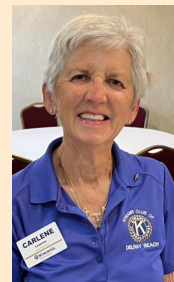

Serving the Hungry

Our program on September 18th was presented by Ruth Mageria, the Executive Director for CROS Ministries.

They believe that to be successful in addressing hunger, the community must come together. For 45 years, CROS Ministries has been a constant presence in the community, "standing in the gap" for our hungry neighbors in Palm Beach and Martin Counties. Their mission is to serve the hungry in Palm Beach and Martin Counties through community collaborations. They use the talents of an incredible volunteer force to help families and individuals from falling into the downward spiral of poverty, food insecurity, and, in many cases, homelessness. Their programs include: seven Community Food Pantries, six pantries that are located in community partner buildings and one mobile "pop-up" pantry distributing food in nine different locations; Gleaning, a produce recovery program partnering with local farmers to recover food that would otherwise go to waste; The Caring Kitchen, a hot meal program; and Children's Programming. Their programs increase access to and availability of nutritious food for families and individuals who are out of food, unemployed, or when their wages, disability, and social security



payments are insufficient to keep up with the increasing costs of inflation. All services are provided without regard to race, religion, national origin, marital status, gender, disability, sexual orientation, or age. For more information go to www.crosministries.org.

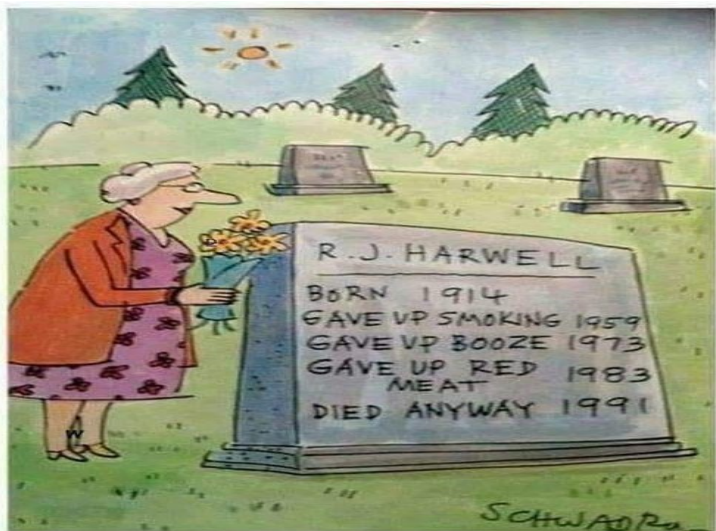

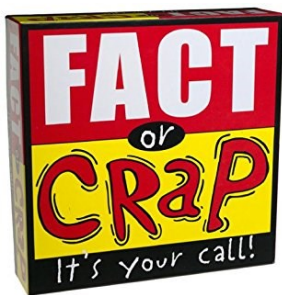

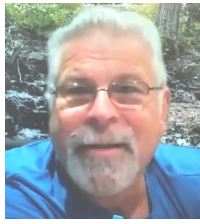

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



September 4:

1781, Los Angeles was founded by Spanish settlers under the leadership of Governor Felipe de Neve.
1949, more than 140 people were injured following a performance by singer Paul Robeson in Peekskill, N.Y. as an anti-Communist mob attacked departing concertgoers.
1972, U.S. swimmer Mark Spitz became the first to win seven medals at a single Olympic Games, winning a seventh gold at the Munich Olympics in the 400-meter medley relay.
1972, the longest-running game show in U.S. history, "The Price is Right," debuted on CBS.
1998, Google was founded by Stanford University Ph.D. students Sergey Brin and Larry Page.

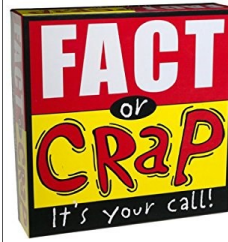

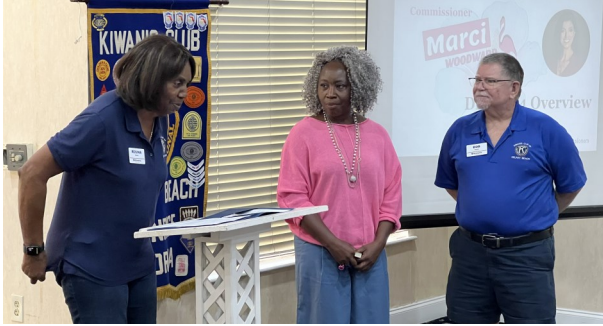
