Our program on August 14th was presented by Brenda Coleman, the Program Manager-Mentoring Programs at Children's Home Society of Florida.

CHS has two mentoring programs - Model Mentoring and Project 18 Mentoring. In Model Mentoring, Kids ages 6 to 12 who live in a single-parent household in Palm Beach County, can be matched with a positive adult mentor who will build self-esteem, teach the importance of respecting authority and empower them achieve educational goals. Mentors and mentees commit to spend four hours together every month for a full year.

Project 18 builds bridges to success for teens in foster care. They can expect to find guidance, friendship and support with a positive role model dedicated to their success - now and in the future. This is for youth in foster care ages 13 to 21 who live in Palm Beach County. They will be matched with an adult mentor in the community. Both agree to meet at least four hours per month for a full two years. Mentors help them prepare for the next stage in life by providing encouragement and guidance. Mentors have the opportunity to make an impact in the life of a child in our community.

The Code of Ethics applies to all elected and appointed county and municipal employees and officials, including advisory board members within Palm Beach County. It does not apply to constitutional offices such as the Sheriff, Property Appraiser, Tax Collector or Clerk and Comptroller.

Change Begins With a Diaper



Our program on August 28th was presented by Dre Garcia, the President of the Diaper Bank covering south Florida.

Their mission is to give children the opportunity to shine by collaborating with local non-profits to address diaper need among families below the poverty line in Palm Beach and Broward Counties. Due to overwhelming demand, they are unable to supply diapers directly to families/individuals.

The Diaper Bank, Covering South Florida, was originally started as a project of the Junior League of Boca Raton. In 2021, recognizing the immense need in South Florida and with a desire to expand their services, they incorporated as an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit separate from the Junior League. Since 2011, they have distributed over 6 million diapers.

Today, they are a group of committed volunteers and supporters who aim to end diaper need in our community. They work hand-in-hand with partner nonprofit agencies to distribute diapers to those who need them the most.

A remarkable trait of Kiwanis throughout its 100-plus years has been its clubs' versatility. The ability to take on projects large and small. The agility to take on emergency needs and the perseverance to complete long-term projects. Though not an official organizational creed, the name Kiwanis has often been spelled out with the mnemonic "Kiwanis Is Where A Need Is Served." Look through a list of Kiwanis accomplishments and you'll find service programs and fundraisers that help persons with disabilities, the ill, the scholarly, the young and the elderly, the environment, farmers, the poor, the homeless, the desperate. ... On and on and on, the list continues.

You'll also find that Kiwanis service can help one child or many. In 1924, the Kiwanis Club of Durham, North Carolina, spread the love by staging a talent play and using revenues to purchase a truck that would carry library books to children living in the rural sections of Durham County. In 1922, the Newark, New Jersey, Kiwanis Club focused its attention on "an innocent victim of the world war." Five months after little Doris Edelman was lifted into a vehicle, en route to Kiwanis sponsored treatments, she was walking and jumping rope. "Today," The Kiwanis Magazine reported in 1922, "she is just like other children. ..."

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

BUYING PRESCRIPTION GLASSES OR CONTACT LENSES

Prioritizing your eye health and monitoring your vision should be an important part of your overall health routine. If you wear glasses or contacts, you should be familiar with the **Eyeglass Rule and Contact Lens Rule**.

The Eyeglass Rule is a federal regulation requiring optometrists and ophthalmologists (eye doctors) to provide patients a copy of their prescription after the completion of an eye examination without extra cost. Eye doctors are required to provide the prescription even if the patient does not request it. Additionally, the rule prohibits eye doctors from conditioning the availability of an examination on a requirement that patients agree to purchase any eyeglasses.

The Contact Lens Rule has two key requirements. The first one is that contact lens prescribers (i.e., optometrists, ophthalmologists, and licensed opticians) must provide patients with a copy of their contact lens prescriptions at the completion of a contact lens fitting. A contact lens fitting may require a follow-up visit after using trial lenses for a few days. The second requirement is that a contact lens seller cannot provide contact lenses to its customer unless the seller either obtains a copy of the prescription or verifies the prescription information with the prescriber through procedures set forth in the Rule.

The rules are designed to enhance consumer choice by protecting a person's right to shop around and look for the best deals and to promote competition among eyeglass and contact lens sellers. Prescribers may provide you with a paper copy of the prescription or a digital copy. You must agree to receive the prescription digitally and to the specific method of delivery (e-mail, text, or online patient portal). If the prescription is sent digitally, you must be able to access, download, and print it. After giving you a copy of your prescription, prescribers are required to obtain a confirmation and keep it for at least three years.

The Eyeglass Rule and the Contact Lens Rule are administered by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). The FTC offers the following tips for using your prescription:

- If you want to buy glasses or contacts from someone other than your prescriber, give a copy of the prescription to the seller yourself. This will ensure the seller has accurate information. Most online sellers will have a process for uploading or sending in a copy of your prescription.

- If you don't give the seller a copy of the prescription, you can give them information about

it and let the seller verify it with your provider. Be sure to include all the information on your

prescription: the brand or manufacturer of the recommended contacts, and the power, base curve, or diameter. Give the seller the contact information for your prescriber to verify the contact lens prescription information. It's important to give the seller the correct information. If you don't, and your prescriber doesn't respond to the seller's verification request within eight business hours, the seller can automatically fill your order — even if you gave them incorrect information. This is called "passive verification." It means you can't count on a prescriber to catch errors in the prescription information you gave to a contact lens seller.

- If you're not buying glasses or contacts anytime soon, keep a copy of your prescriptions in a safe place. Or save a picture of your prescription on your phone or computer. It will help if you need to order glasses or contacts quickly.

- You cannot use an expired prescription to purchase glasses or contact lenses. State law determines when your prescription for eyeglasses or contact lenses will expire. Eyeglass prescriptions usually are good for a year or two, but state laws vary. The Contact Lens Rule says that contact lens prescriptions must be good for at least a year, unless your prescriber has a medical reason for making it shorter. Don't try to buy glasses or contact lenses with an expired prescription. Your eye health changes over time, so it's important to have regular comprehensive eye health exams.

If you suspect an eye care prescriber is violating the Eyeglass Rule or the Contact Lens Rule, report it to the FTC at ftc.gov/complaint. For a more in-depth look at your prescription rights for contacts — and eyeglasses — take a look at Understanding Your Prescription Rights for Glasses and Contact Lenses. It includes a list of what you should see in your prescription.

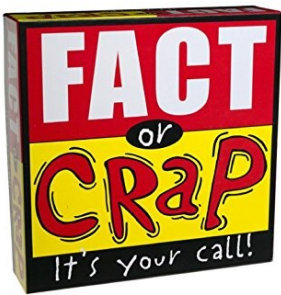

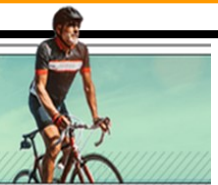

HEALTHY LIVING TIP



3 Yoga Poses for Beginners

The first pose is a downward-facing dog used in most yoga practices. In it, you have your arms stacked under your shoulders, your bottom in the air, and your back legs straight. Your body is in the shape of an upside-down "V."

The next is Crescent Lunge. Stand in a forward lunge with one foot in front and bent. Your back leg is straight. Now, straighten your arms and lift them over your head. This pose is often used in yoga flow classes.

Last, we have the Triangle pose. Step your feet apart (wider than your shoulders). Then, hinge at your hip and lean over your front leg. Reach down with the same arm in front and rest it on the floor or a yoga block.

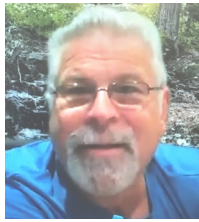

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History". Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



August 7:

1789, the U.S. Department of War was established by Congress.
 1942, U.S. and other allied forces landed at Guadalcanal, marking the start of the first major allied offensive in the Pacific during World War II.
 1974, French highwire artist Philippe Petit performed an unapproved tightrope walk between the two towers of the World Trade Center in New York, over 1,300 feet above the ground; the event would be chronicled in the Academy Award-winning documentary film "Man on Wire."
 1978, President Jimmy Carter declared the Love Canal environmental disaster in Niagara Falls, N.Y. a federal health emergency; it would later top the initial list of Superfund cleanup sites.
 1990, President George H.W. Bush ordered U.S. troops and warplanes to Saudi Arabia to guard the oil-rich desert kingdom against a possible invasion by Iraq.
 2007, San Francisco's Barry Bonds hit home run No. 756 to break Hank Aaron's storied record with one out in the fifth inning of a game against the Washington Nationals, who won, 8-6.
 2012, to avoid a possible death penalty, Jared Lee Loughner agreed to spend the rest of his life in prison, accepting that he went on a deadly shooting rampage at an Arizona political gathering in 2011 that left six people dead and 13 injured, including U.S. Rep. Gabby Giffords.

August 14:

1935, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act into law, ensuring income for elderly Americans and creating a federal unemployment insurance program.
 1945, President Harry S. Truman announced that Imperial Japan had surrendered unconditionally, ending World War II.
 1995, Shannon Faulkner officially became the first female cadet in the history of The Citadel, South Carolina's state military college. (However, Faulkner quit the school less than a week later, citing the stress of her court fight, and her isolation among the male cadets.)
 1997, an unrepentant Timothy McVeigh was formally sentenced to death for the Oklahoma City bombing. (McVeigh was executed by lethal injection in 2001.)
 2009, Charles Manson follower Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme, 60, convicted of trying to assassinate President Gerald Ford in 1975, was released from a Texas prison hospital after more than three decades behind bars.
 2016, Usain Bolt became the first athlete to win the 100m dash in three consecutive Olympics, taking gold at the Summer Games in Rio.

1831, Nat Turner launched a violent slave rebellion in Virginia, resulting in the deaths of at least 55 white people; scores of Black people were killed in retribution in the aftermath of the rebellion, and Turner was later executed.
 1858, the first of seven debates took place between Illinois senatorial contenders Abraham Lincoln and Stephen Douglas.
 1911, Leonardo da Vinci's "Mona Lisa" was stolen from the Louvre Museum in Paris. (It was recovered two years later in Italy.)
 1944, the United States, Britain, the Soviet Union and China opened talks at Dumbarton Oaks in Washington that helped pave the way for establishment of the United Nations.
 1959, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed a proclamation officially declaring Hawaii the 50th state.
 1993, in a serious setback for NASA, engineers lost contact with the Mars Observer spacecraft as it was about to reach the red planet on a \$980 million mission.
 2000, rescue efforts to reach the sunken Russian nuclear submarine Kursk ended with divers announcing none of the 118 sailors had survived.
 2017, Americans witnessed their first full-blown coast-to-coast solar eclipse since World War I, with eclipse-watchers gathering along a path of totality extending 2,600 miles across the continent.
 2018, Michael Cohen, President Donald Trump's former personal lawyer and fixer, pleaded guilty to campaign-finance violations and other charges; Cohen said Trump directed him to arrange the payment of hush money to porn star Stormy Daniels and former Playboy model Karen McDougal to fend off damage to his White House bid. (Trump was found guilty of 34 felony counts of falsifying business records related to the payments in May 2024.)

1845, the first issue of "Scientific American" magazine was published; it remains the oldest continuously published magazine in the United States.
 1862, the Second Battle of Bull Run began in Prince William County, Virginia, during the Civil War; the Union army retreated two days later after suffering 14,000 casualties.
 1898, pharmacist Caleb Bradham of New Bern, North Carolina changed the name of the carbonated beverage he'd created five years earlier from "Brad's Drink" to "Pepsi-Cola."
 1957, U.S. Senator Strom Thurmond (D-S.C.) began what remains the longest speaking filibuster in Senate history (24 hours and 18 minutes) in an effort to stall the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1957.
 1963, during the March on Washington, the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his "I Have a Dream" speech before an estimated 250,000 people in front of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C.
 2016, six scientists completed a yearlong Mars simulation on the big island of Hawaii, where they emerged after living in a dome in near isolation on Mauna Loa.

DID YOU KNOW?

Changes To Driver License Numbers

The next time you renew or replace your driver license or identification card in person or online, you will be issued a new driver license or ID number. There is no need to immediately replace your current driver license or ID, as you will be issued a new number when it is time for you to renew or replace your driver license or ID.

The change is taking place because, on July 31, the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FLHSMV) began implementing legislation which amends

Florida Statute 322.14(1)(a), requiring driver license and ID card numbers must now contain at least four randomly generated digits. This new system aims to improve security and safeguard individuals' identities.

Those applying for a first-time driver license or identification card will be issued a card that meets the new statutory numbering requirements. Once you are issued a driver license or identification card with a new number that meets the new requirements, the number will not change unless your last name changes.

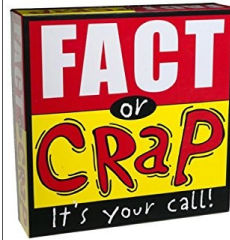

Richard Simmons was a Kiwanis Children's Fund donor



Brother of Kiwanian Lenny Simmons, the health and fitness icon supported the Kiwanis mission in multiple ways.

When beloved health and fitness instructor Richard Simmons passed away in July, many news reports noted the inspiration and entertainment he gave the world during his lifetime. One lesser-known aspect of his life, though, was his generosity to youth through Kiwanis International and the Kiwanis Children's Fund.

Brother of Lenny Simmons (a 40-year member of the Kiwanis Club of New Orleans, Louisiana, U.S., and a past trustee of Kiwanis International), Richard himself was a George F. Hixson Fellow, with 15 Hixson Diamond levels. In fact, he and Lenny each received their first Hixson during a joint presentation in 1992. (Lenny's wife, Cathy, is a 25-year member of the New Orleans club and was recently appointed to be a Children's Fund Trustee starting in October.)

Richard — or "Dicky," as family members called him — earned three of his Hixson levels in 1994, when he donated more than US\$3,000 to Kiwanis International's first worldwide service project to help eliminate iodine deficiency disorders around the world.

Richard received the International Tablet of Honor in 1997. For the Simmons family, it was a particularly special moment: As governor of the Louisiana-Mississippi-West Tennessee District, Lenny personally presented the honor during the district's convention that year.

Richard was proud of the work his brother and sister-in-law did through Kiwanis, and he continued supporting the organization through their home club through the years.

"It's not the amount of the gifts, but the fact that Dicky, as a non-Kiwanian, was so very generous," Lenny says. "He never charged for appearing at any of the conventions and he was generous with donating all the sales of his merchandise during conventions back to the Children's Fund. He truly cared about children."
