Commitment: Kiwanis International believes that opportunity and dignity are essential to making the Kiwanis experience as fulfilling as possible for members, partners and others in the communities where we serve. Kiwanis has a continuing commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion. By working together, members achieve what one person cannot accomplish alone.



Impact: We are creative with our ideas. Whether rolling up our sleeves or opening our wallets, Kiwanians make transformative changes in communities around the world. On average, members of the Kiwanis family host approximately 150,000 service projects and complete more than 19 million service hours a year. Every year, our clubs raise more than US\$100 million to support community causes — in addition to supporting the Kiwanis Children's Fund.

- To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.
 - To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.
 - To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards.
 - To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship.
 - To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.
 - To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and goodwill.

Worldwide Service Focus

- **Young Children: Priority One** is a program supported by Kiwanis International and thousands of clubs worldwide. It focuses on maternal and child health, child care and development, parent education and support, and safety and pediatric trauma.
- The **Worldwide Service Project** in 1995 was Kiwanis-family initiative in partnership with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to virtually eliminate the world's leading cause of preventable mental retardation, iodine deficiency disorders (IDD).
- Our most recent **Worldwide Service Project** is The Eliminate Project, where Kiwanis International and UNICEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus, raising US\$110 million and save or protect 55 million lives.



Organization Structure

Kiwanis International is the worldwide organization to which each Kiwanis club and member belongs; and now comprises over 550,000 members — men, women, boys and girls — worldwide.

It is administered by the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees.

Each club is clustered together with clubs in the area to form a division.

We sponsor two Key Clubs and Builders Clubs to foster community outreach at the middle and high school levels.



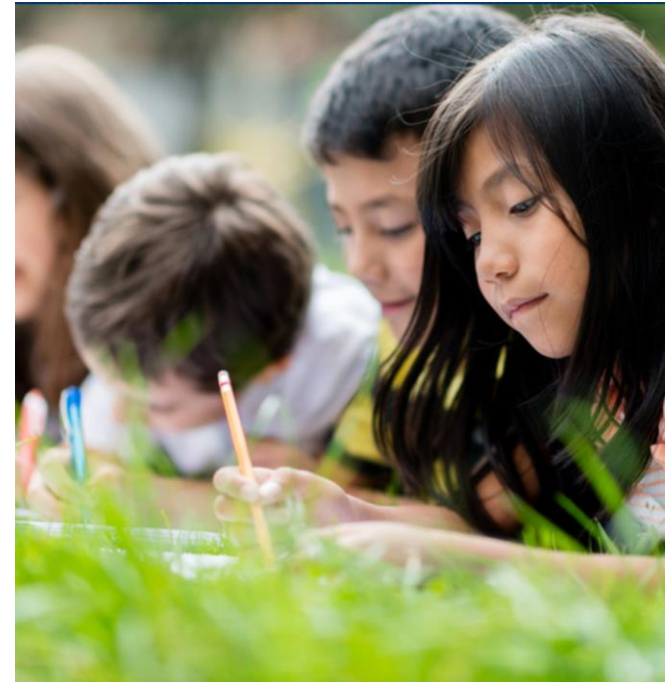
Who Do We Help?

Who Do We Help?

AVDA

Aid to Victims of Domestic Abuse. Each month our Treasurer gives us a check for \$125.00 to shop for groceries for the AVDA shelter. This includes such items as milk, eggs, juice, cold cuts, fresh fruits and vegetables. Our Club has also bought the shelter a replacement refrigerator and freezer and a microwave oven. Through our Club's Thanksgiving Committee we provide turkey dinners for those in residence for Thanksgiving Day.

Terrific Kids Reward Program

Each grading period, we provide awards and bumper stickers to the children at Orchard View Elementary for reaching goals assigned by their teachers. The number of students impacted by this program reach over 100 students each grading period.

Fall & Spring Police Appreciation Awards

The Delray Beach Kiwanis recognizes the achievements of the officers and employees of the Delray Beach Police Department. Each recipient receives recognition, a framed certificate of appreciation and their name goes on a plaque at the police station.

Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is a special time of year and each year we deliver approximately 350 Thanksgiving meals to families in need in our area. The turkeys and the mashed potatoes, gravy, stuffing, and vegetables are enjoyed by all of our recipients and it makes us feel that we are giving back to families in need.
