Trashy Mermaids Cleanup

Our program on November 27th was presented by Julie Travis & Joanie Fisk of Trashy Mermaids. Travis loves mermaids and just about all things ocean-related.

If there’s one thing she can’t stand, however, it’s debris scattered along her favorite stretches of Delray Beach’s public beach.

So when Travis decided to create a group of beach-cleaning women who would scour the sand looking for debris, the name Trashy Mermaids was the perfect fit. “Julie has this flair for fun, but she takes a serious approach to environmental issues,” says Joan Fisk, her longtime friend and fellow Trashy Mermaid.

Travis is the SEA-EO, instead of the CEO, and Fisk is the SEA-OO. There’s also SEA-IO. The group meets once a month for what Travis appropriately named “trash talk.”

A longtime Delray Beach resident who works full time in sales support for Sensormatic Retail Solutions, Travis makes being at the beach every weekend part of her routine. “I get to the beach every chance I get,” she said. “But I can’t come here every Saturday and Sunday and look at all the disgusting things on the sand.” Among the things she’s seen are used personal hygiene products, underwear and even buried soiled diapers. It was a dead sea turtle at the shoreline, however, that led to Travis’ transformation from a silent spectator into a mermaid with a mission. “That was the spark that made me say I had to do something, even if it was just me, myself and I,” she said.

What really struck Travis was the group of people who had gathered around the turtle — whose death she was told was caused by ingesting trash in the ocean — and were taking photos.

Bringing People Together In Celebration of Black History, the Spady Museum is the only museum of its kind in Palm Beach County dedicated to showcasing the contributions of members of the African Diaspora in Florida and the U.S.



Their current exhibit is called “Inside Outside”, a solo exhibit by conceptual artist Yves Gabriel, on display at the Spady Museum through January 6, 2025. Gabriel’s abstract, multimedia creations encourage viewers to engage in conversations, both with each other and within themselves, sparking curiosity and dialogue about significant social and cultural issues.

Other upcoming events include the Kwanza Celebration where families will come together to make gifts, enjoy live music, engage in art activities, and participate in storytelling. In January, they will Celebrate MLK Day at the Spady Museum’s “I Have A Dream” Brunch, featuring guest speaker Don Mizell, Esq., whose work helped establish the MLK national holiday, and welcoming over 300 attendees from Palm Beach and Broward counties.

III. Secretary's Report: Approve Minutes of September 30, 2024. Motion made by: Bill Morse, Seconded by: Peggy Kelleher Passed (Krieg opposed)

IV. Financial Report:

There was no Financial Report at this time. Bill Morse will meet with former Treasurer Dale Morrison to coordinate access to the bank statements.

V. Old Business:

A. Membership Report (Bill Morse)

Marjorie Waldo submitted letter of resignation. Kiwanis web site lists 42 members in Delray club. The club Secretary will have to officially remove her name.

B. Golf Tournament recap (Scott Youngberg). Event raised \$10,995, netted \$5,506. The following motion was made: Approve payment of \$2,500 to Achievement Centers for Children and Families and \$1,000 to Living Hungry, leaving \$2,006 for Delray Kiwanis. Motion made by: Scott Youngberg, Seconded by: Joel Davidson, Passed unanimously.

C. Terrific Kids (Peggy Kelleher). Peggy Kelleher to send out information and ask for RSVPs from members who plan to attend the November 22nd event.

D. Charter Night (David Freeburn). To be held at Finnegan's, need to set date. David Freeburn to contact Ronnie Dunayer and send potential dates to membership.

E. Boca Club support needs (Pam Davidson). Pam Davidson reported that the newly established Boca club is holding its first official fundraising event on Friday November 22nd at the Boca Falls clubhouse. They would appreciate it if some Delray Kiwanis members would attend. Information on this event will be provided to the Delray members.

F. New member folder revamp (Gina Sablo). Gina Sablo stated that she had updated the information for new members and provided

several copies to membership chair Carlene. She was waiting on feedback. She will send it to the board members for review today. G. Holiday Party. Party is to be held Saturday December 14th at Jay Alperin's home. Scott will send out information to members and request RSVPs.

VI. New Business

A. Pinegrove Elementary School request (Pam Davidson). Pam Davidson reported that she had received a letter from the Pinegrove Elementary School principal seeking a partnership with Delray Kiwanis. There were no details provided regarding the type of assistance the school is seeking. Pam will make an appointment with the principal to get more specific information on the school's needs.

B. MLK Breakfast (Rich Pollack). Rich Pollack stated that there are two items to consider involving the Spady Cultural Heritage Museum: the annual Martin Luther King Jr. breakfast and a \$500 grant request for a children's program. The breakfast cost \$55 per person, Rich suggested that Kiwanis cover a portion of the cost.

1. The following motions were made: Approve a grant in the amount of \$250 for Spady Museum children's program. Motion made by Peggy Kelleher, Seconded by Pam Davidson. Passed unanimously.

2. Kiwanis to subsidize the cost for members attending the MLK Jr. breakfast in an amount up to \$20 per person, up to a total of \$200. Motion made by Peggy Kelleher, Seconded by Pam Davidson. Passed unanimously.

3. Fundraising Idea (Rich Pollack). Rich Pollack reported that a joint event is to be held with the Rotary Club at the miniature golf course Putt'n Around on February 6th. Additional details will be forthcoming.

4. Story Trail - (discussion brought up by Rich Pollack). A written explanation of the project and a proposed budget were provided to the board. There was discussion as to the appropriateness of voting on the item due to the fact that several board members who felt strongly about the project were absent from this meeting. Pam Davidson expressed concern that our club had received a grant for this project several months ago and had not moved forward with implementation of the trail. The consensus was to defer the item to a special meeting that would be held when Jay Alperin and Carlene Laseter could attend, and when more detailed information regarding the Kiwanis Foundation fund balance was available.

5 online scams to watch for this holiday season

From Aura, a leader in online protection, here are the most common ways that scammers target you during the holidays:

1. Fake social media ads: Scammers create ads leading to bogus stores to steal money or info
2. Phony delivery texts: Watch for messages claiming a package delay or extra fee
3. Fraudulent charities: Be cautious of fake charities and GoFundMe campaigns
4. Bogus deals: Avoid "too-good-to-be-true" deals on rare items or travel tickets
5. Impersonation scams: Fake surveys or giveaways from "brands" like Amazon aim to grab your data









HEALTHY LIVING TIP



Know Your Key Health Numbers

According to the American Heart Association, adults should know their key health numbers, including total cholesterol, HDL (good cholesterol), blood pressure, blood sugar, and body mass index. If you're unsure what your "numbers" are, schedule a visit with your doctor to monitor them and understand why each is important. Here's a quick definition of each metric:

- **Cholesterol** – Cholesterol is a lipoprotein in our body's tissues that forms and maintains cell membranes.
- **Body mass index (BMI)** – Your BMI is calculated using your height and weight and can help determine whether you're underweight, at a healthy weight, or overweight.
- **Blood pressure** – Blood pressure refers to the amount of force the heart must use to pump blood throughout the body.
- **Blood sugar** – Blood sugar measures the concentration of glucose in the blood.

November 6:

1860, former Illinois congressman Abraham Lincoln of the Republican Party was elected President of the United States as he defeated John Breckinridge, John Bell and Stephen Douglas.

1888, Republican presidential candidate Benjamin Harrison won the electoral vote over incumbent Democrat Grover Cleveland, despite Cleveland gaining 90,000 more total votes; it would be the last time the popular vote winner would lose the election until 2000.

1947, "Meet the Press," the longest-running television show in America, made its debut on NBC; the host was the show's co-creator, Martha Rountree.

1977, 39 people were killed when the Kelly Barnes Dam in Georgia burst, sending a wall of water through Toccoa Falls College.

Journalist-author Maria Shriver is 69.

Actor Ethan Hawke is 54.

Actor Thandiwe (tan-DEE'-way) Newton is 52.

Actor Emma Stone is 36.

November 13:

1775, during the Revolutionary War, American troops captured Montreal under the command of Continental Army Gen. Richard Montgomery.

1956, the U.S. Supreme Court affirmed a lower court ruling which found Alabama bus segregation laws were illegal.

1971, the U.S. space probe Mariner 9 went into orbit around Mars, becoming the first spacecraft to orbit another planet.

1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was dedicated on the National Mall in Washington, D.C.

2001, U.S.-backed Northern Alliance fighters in Afghanistan entered Kabul as Taliban forces retreated from the capital city.

2015, Islamic State militants carried out a set of coordinated attacks in Paris at the national stadium, in a crowded concert hall, in restaurants and on streets, killing 130 people in the worst attack on French soil since World War II.

November 20:

1910, Francisco Madero led a revolt against Mexican President Porfirio Díaz, marking the beginning of the decade-long Mexican Revolution.

1945, 22 former Nazi officials went on trial before an international war crimes tribunal in Nuremberg, Germany. (Almost a year later, the International Military Tribunal sentenced 12 of the defendants to death; seven received prison sentences ranging from 10 years to life; three were acquitted.)

1947, Britain's future queen, Princess Elizabeth, married Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, at Westminster Abbey.

1982, the University of California, Berkeley, football team defeated Stanford University by scoring a touchdown on a lateral-filled kickoff return on the last play of the game, despite the Stanford marching band entering the field of play, thinking Stanford had already won. In college football lore, the bizarre finish is often referred to simply as "The Play."

2003, record producer Phil Spector was charged with murder in the shooting death of an actor, Lana Clarkson, at his home in Alhambra, California. (Spector's first trial ended with a hung jury in 2007; he was convicted of second-degree murder in 2009.)

November 27:

1924, Macy's first Thanksgiving Day parade — billed as a "Christmas Parade" — took place in New York.

1934, bank robber and "Public Enemy No. 1" Lester Joseph Gillis, better known as George "Baby Face" Nelson, was killed in a gun battle with FBI agents in Barrington, Illinois.

1970, Pope Paul VI, visiting the Philippines, was slightly wounded at the Manila airport by a dagger-wielding Bolivian painter disguised as a priest.

2003, President George W. Bush flew to Iraq under extraordinary secrecy and security to spend Thanksgiving with U.S. troops and thank them for "defending the American people from danger."

2015, a gunman attacked a Planned Parenthood clinic in Colorado Springs, Colorado, killing three people and injuring nine. (The prosecution of suspect Robert Dear stalled in state court, and then federal court, after he was repeatedly found mentally incompetent to stand trial.)



Lee Kuan Yong Inspires Possibilities

From the beginning, 2024-25 Kiwanis International President Lee Kuan Yong was a good fit for Kiwanis — and vice versa. The timing was right. His skills were right. And the way the organization's mission matched his need to serve his community was right.

In 1992, Lee returned to Malaysia after spending 17 years away — seven years in England, seven in Hong Kong and three in Canada. He took a job as deputy controller for a listed corporation and soon found himself in charge of organizing a weekend retreat: a "motoring treasure hunt," which is a popular group activity in his home country.

As part of his job, Lee was asked to get in touch with a particular person — who turned out to be an old classmate from primary school. "He said yes," Lee recalls. "But he also said, 'You have to come to dinner at a meeting of mine.'" Lee went, returning a favor for his old friend, but as it turned out, that meeting of the Kiwanis Club of Kuala Lumpur also brought back deeper memories. "It reminded me of things I did in high school with a similar kind of group," he says. "Joining Kiwanis was easy because I was having dinner with like-minded people — and they were doing the kinds of things I had wanted to grow up to do."

Looking back to 1993, when he officially joined Kiwanis, Lee can see how a successful club goes beyond service and fellowship — it emphasizes integrating new members into its regular operations. For Lee, feeling needed was a big part of feeling welcomed by his club. As a chartered accountant, or CPA, he had talents that the Kuala Lumpur club recognized, particularly since fundraising has always been a big part of its events and activities.

"I felt I could contribute in my own way," Lee says. "I've always found my career and Kiwanis meshed very well." In fact, he adds, the club has a tradition of engaging new members from the beginning. Early on, Lee was asked to chair the club's Programs Committee, making him responsible for inviting and arranging guest speakers for meetings. He wasn't actively looking for a leadership role, he says, but getting one deepened his involvement with the club — and his passion for helping it thrive.

"The role was just a responsibility," he says. "But it was useful. It allowed me to be connected with all the other members because part of [the responsibility] was encouraging attendance." Even now, Lee takes pride in the club's meeting attendance for that year, which doubled from the previous year. "I made a point of calling every member," he says. "I did my job with enthusiasm. That may have given other members the idea that I was a potential leader." He smiles when he thinks back on that possibility. "I seldom say no," he says.
