Our program on January 15th was presented by Chris Wilson, President of Kids Kickstart.

Founded in 2020, the mission of Kids

Kickstart is to provide resources and tools in the form of laptops, software, cloud services and other tangible supports directly to students and their schools and other non-profit families to further their economic and educational opportunities.

Kids Kickstart targets kids, ages 7-17 who aspire to further their education and professional skills but lack access to their own personal inhome computers and software to further their educational and creative interests out of the classroom. According to the AP Survey 2017, 17% of students lack access to a home computer and 3 million students do not have broadband Internet.

This was even more evident with the global pandemic, COVID-19 which closed schools and put a

nation of school children and their families into home schooling and virtual learning without the proper tools. Students need every opportunity to learn and grow in a time that technology reigns supreme. Kids Kickstart goal is to provide opportunities to work with the most advanced technology like AI and cloud computing, by giving them the tools and resources needed.

Their process is to partner with organizations aligned with their mission to help underserved kids.

Kids Kickstart is entirely volunteer driven. However, as the organization grows and raises additional funds. they propose to expand mentoring programs with professionals in the technology, scientific, creative and entrepreneurship areas of interest. 

Board Meeting Notes

Our club's recent Board Meeting took place via Zoom on January 6th. Here are some notes:

I. Board Attendance: President David Freeburn: Secretary Jay Alperin, Treasurer Bill Morse. Directors: Kelleher, Davidson, Pam; Krieg,

II. Foundation Attendance: President Freeburn, Vice-President

Pollack; Directors: Colonna, Youngberg, PDavidson.

III. Secretary's Report: Approve Minutes of December 2, 2024 meeting. Changes were proposed to the draft minutes, including changing "Boynton" Women's Club to "Delray Beach" and adding Pam Davidson's name to the list of Foundation Board directors. Motion to Approve as modified by Ezra Krieg, Seconded by: Joel Davidson. Passed

IV. Financial Report:

Bill Morse reported that due to time constraints he had been unable to do a detailed analysis of the club's finances, however, he can report that the club has approximately \$40,000 in the bank account. David Freeburn suggested that when the information is available it be sent out to the members.

V. Old Business:

A. MLK Breakfast. Rich Pollack said as of yet he is unsure of how many people planned to attend the event. Bill Morse said that 3 people had paid for the breakfast so far.

B. Putt Putt Golf Challenge – February 6. Rich stated that a sign up sheet will be distributed at Wednesday's meeting.

C. Pine Grove request for support - (Pam). There was still no response from phone calls to the school principal. Pam will continue trying to

D. Real Men Bake. Peggy reported that 25 bakers had signed up to participate, more are expected to join. She is continuing to work with Jocelyn Patrick to promote the event. The date of the event is February 10th, tickets are \$40.00 each.

E. Delray Affair. Rich suggested that Bob Hayes be invited to the next board meeting to give an update on this event. New Business

A. Christmas in July 5K - February 1st. Ezra stated that there will be a team from Delray Kiwanis participating in this event. Pam Davidson

B. Shoe Drive for Jacob's Shoes. Andrea Devoe is planning a used shoe collection for the nonprofit organization Jacob's Shoes. She will collect shoes that are used but still wearable at the weekly Kiwanis meetings through the end of January.

C. IHOP Pancake Day – March 4th. Joel Davidson stated that a sign up sheet will be distributed for this event. Rich and Jay asked what charity is the beneficiary of this event. It was determined that the charity should be identified, then members can be notified and vote

D. Foundation Recap. Rich had sent a summary of 2024 activities that the Foundation has been involved in. Pam noted that a copy could be sent with the December Kiwanis report, and Rich suggested it be included in the packets for new club members. Other suggestions were that it be put on a banner, or laminated sheets, or foam boards. Bob Hayes should be consulted for his opinion on this.

E. Grant Request – All People's Day. An application was received for a \$500 grant. Last year Kiwanis gave them \$250 and participated in their event. The consensus was that the club not participate this year. There was a discussion regarding the benefits that this organization provides. Ezra thought that their goal to unite people of diverse backgrounds is consistent with Kiwanis goals. Motion to approve grant for \$250 by Ezra Krieg, Seconded by Bill Morse. Motion passed (Jay Alperin and Joel Davidson opposed, Rich Pollack abstained)

A. Story Trail - Bill Morse asked about the status of the Story Trail project, as there are grant funds sitting unspent in the account. Joel replied that Reeve Bright is working on the agreement with the City. B. Kiwanis Training - David Freeburn noticed an item in the newsletter about a Kiwanis training program called Amplify, available for \$50. Pam stated the program is primarily geared toward members who are seeking s leadership position in Kiwanis (i.e. Governor, Lt. Governor, etc.).

C. Nominations for officers - need to identify which positions are open, establish a nominating committee. Scott will provide a list of positions and David will work on putting a committee together.

D. Golf Tournament - Joel asked what the status is of the next golf tournament. Scott offered to contact Linda Brown to see if she would be interested in running the next tournament.

E. Fund Raising – Joel suggested that new fund raising ideas be generated and considered.. Bill Morse thought the Real Men Bake event might pose an opportunity for the club. Ezra – rather than throw out ideas at this meeting, the fundraising committee should be asked to present ideas. David - will ask committee to come up with suggestions for next meeting.



The average life expectancy in ancient Rome was 35 years.



The Roman Empire is responsible for countless innovations that are still used on a daily basis, but it would be putting it lightly to say that medical science has advanced quite a bit since Rome fell. Given that - as well as all the gladiators, wars, and assassinated emperors — it shouldn't come as too much of a surprise to learn that life expectancy in ancient Rome was just 35 years. Yet the real culprit behind that figure is actually the infant mortality rate at the time, as some 25% of babies born in the first century CE didn't make it past 1 year old, and only half survived past the age of 10.

Life expectancy is an average, and one that has tended to increase over time, but lifespan hasn't actually changed much in human history. Indeed, it was not uncommon for ancient Romans to live to a ripe old age. Gordian I was 81 when he became emperor of Rome, and Roman statesman Cicero's wife Terentia lived to be 103, for instance. Pliny the Elder (who, despite his moniker, lived to be just 55 before dying in the eruption of Mount Vesuvius) was particularly impressed by one centenarian he studied. He wrote, "The solitary instance of Xenophilus, the musician, who lived one hundred and five years without any infirmity of body, must be regarded then as a kind of miracle."

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

One-and-a-Half Minute Walk

My name is Alexander, I am a cardiologist and a paramedic. A very important warning for those who wake up at night to go to the bathroom...

You must be careful and use the "One-and-a-Half-minute law" which is scientifically proven. By waking up suddenly for one's physiological needs normally, we often hear that someone "was well in good health and died suddenly during the night without reason. "

The most likely reason is that when that person woke up to go to the bathroom, he/she got up from bed in a hurry, but the brain needs greater blood flow, for having rested, causing a state of fainting and that is when the stroke happens. It is recommended to learn the "One-and-a-Half -minute law" that can save your life

When you wake up to go to the bathroom, you must first: Lay for 30 seconds after waking up and then sit up in bed for 30 more seconds lowering your legs quietly and sit like that for another 30 seconds " and only then get up to go to the bathroom.

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



January 1:

1804, Haiti declared itself independent from France, becoming the world's first

Black-majority republic.

1808, the federal law prohibiting the importation of enslaved people to the United States took effect.

1818, Mary Shelley's novel "Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus" was first published in London, when Shelley was 20 years old. 1863, U.S. President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation

during the Civil War, declaring that all enslaved people in rebellious states "are, and henceforward shall be free."

1892, the Ellis Island Immigration Station in New York formally opened, processing nearly 700 immigrants on its first day; nearly 12 million immigrants would ultimately pass through the station before its closure in 1954. 2000, an anxious world held its breath as computers silently switched to the year

2000, but the dreaded "Y2K bug" caused few serious issues.

Birthdays: Filmmaker Frederick Wiseman is 95. Actor Frank Langella is 87. Musician Country Joe McDonald is 83. DJ Grandmaster Flash is 67. Actor Morris Chestnut is 56.

<u>January 8:</u>

1790, President George Washington delivered the first State of the Union address in New York City.

1815, the last major engagement of the War of 1812 came to an end as U.S. forces defeated the British in the Battle of New Orleans, not having received word of the signing of a peace treaty.

1867, the U.S. House of Representatives joined the Senate in overriding

President Andrew Johnson's veto of the District of Columbia Suffrage Act, giving Black men in the nation's capital the right to vote.

1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson, in his State of the Union address, declared an "unconditional war on poverty in America."
1998, Ramzi Yousef (RAHM'-zee YOO'-sef), the mastermind of the 1993 World Trade Center bombing, was sentenced in New York to life in prison without the

possibility of parole.
2011, U.S. Rep. Gabrielle Giffords, D-Ariz., was shot and critically wounded when a gunman opened fire as the congresswoman met with constituents in Tucson; six people were killed and 12 others were injured. 





Kiwanians in Canada help refugees from Ukraine thrive in their new country.

Kiwanians have a heart for service — and in Barrie, Ontario, Canada, that heart extends to helping families in need from over 7,700 kilometers away.

In 2021, members of the Kiwanis Club of Barrie — including Helen Ellement and her sister, Cathy Locke — were deciding how to mark the club's 100th anniversary. At a church service, Ellement and Locke learned that refugees from Ukraine would be traveling to Canada and needed places to stay. At the time, Locke had been preparing to sell her large home so she could purchase a smaller residence.

"So of course we just looked at each other," Ellement recalls, "and she said, 'I know what I'm going to do."

Locke offered to house some incoming refugees while they adjusted to living in a different country, learning a new language and finding employment. And Ellement thought of a way to celebrate the club's centennial: spend CA\$100,000 on service projects, a third of which would fund the refugees' flights to Canada.

The club's donation paid for six families — a total of 33 people to relocate. And once they arrived, Ellement, the current lieutenant governor of Kiwanis Division 8, and Locke, now the club's president-elect, led efforts to help the families settle in. The sisters gathered necessities ranging from bedding to paper goods, made doctor appointments, located a service that would help determine grade placement levels for the school-age students, and even helped find jobs for some of the adults.

"Pretty much anything you would do for your own kids, that's what we've been doing for the Ukrainian families," Ellement says.



Generosity rewarded

Meanwhile, instead of selling her home, Locke invited the largest family group — two parents and 11 children and teens to live in the residence. Locke relocated to what became a lower -level apartment, complete with separate access; the family moved into the remainder of the house.

The families have not let this generosity go unrewarded. "They've worked at every function that Kiwanis does that we need help with," Ellement says. "So they've helped us as much as we've helped them. They've been fabulous."

Now Ellement and Locke are writing letters of recommendation to help the families gain permanent residency in Canada. "They've all gotten jobs, and they've worked very hard. They've become members of their community," says Ellement. "They feel like family, and they feel like we're their family."
