Our program on June 4th was presented by Alexcia Cox, State Attorney for Florida's 15th Judicial Circuit.

The State Attorney's Office is responsible for representing the community in the prosecution of criminal charges, from simple traffic offenses to capital murder. Their mission is to secure justice, safeguard victims and serve the people.

Alexcia leads a team of 115 prosecutors and 180 professional staff in five offices throughout Palm Beach County, including Delray Beach.

The prosecutors and staff have a solemn responsibility to all of the

citizens of Palm Beach County that their rights will be upheld and that the law will be applied equally to all, regardless of their background or circumstances ... They



have to be committed not to getting convictions, but to seeking justice.

Cases include public safety, tackling violent crime - including repeat offenders, victim rights, elder crime, robbery, property deed fraud, animal cruelty, and more.

Our club's recent Board Meeting took place via Zoom on May 5th. Here are the notes:

I. Board Attendance: President Dave Freeburn, Secretary Jay Alperin, Treasurer Bill Morse. Directors: Kelleher, Davidson, Pam; Krieg, Davidson, Joel; Sablo, Devoe, Laseter

II. Foundation Attendance : President Freeburn, Vice-President Pollack; Secretary Alperin; Treasurer Morse, Directors: Colonna, Youngberg, PDavidson.

III. Secretary's Report: Minutes of May 5, 2025 Kiwanis board meeting. Motion to approve made by Jay Alperin. Seconded by Peggy Kelleher. Approved unanimously

IV. Financial Report: Bill Morse reported that there is \$11,298 in the Foundation account, and approximately \$15,000 in the Club account. Motion to accept the Financial Report. Motion made by Jay Alperin. Seconded by Peggy Kelleher. Approved unanimously.
V. Old Business:

A. Story Trail Committee Update. Joel Davidson reported that the Story Trail Committee submitted four (4) book titles to the City and all were approved. Copyrights will not be an issue. The Committee's next meeting will be at Barwick Park on Monday June 16th at 9 a.m.

B. Food Drive Recap and alternative food drive initiatives. Rich Pollack informed the Board that 310 food items had been collected from the members. David Freeburn asked if the club should continue the food drive, perhaps with a different organization. Ezra Krieg remarked that if that was the direction taken we should look at working with several different organizations and maybe do it periodically. Pam Davidson felt that when you have an ongoing donation drive people get burned out and the impact is diluted. The consensus was not to have an ongoing drive at this time. Rich also reported on the Cathy Shore (Vietnam veteran nurse) presentation – 43 people attended.

C. Pancakes, Pints and Pigskins. Peggy Kelleher has confirmed the November 16th date with Finnegan's. The event will be similar to the previous one, we will need sponsors, auction items and raffle items. We expect a larger turnout due to the popularity of the last event.

D. Happy Hour. Fifteen (15) people attended the most recent happy hour at Tim Finnegan's. The consensus was to have another one there in July.

E. Alternate meeting location options during golf course construction. The City is planning to make renovations to the golf club – they hope to start in November or December. Kiwanis will not be able to meet there while construction is underway. Jay Alperin asked board members to come up with ideas for alternate meeting sites.

F. Fundraising Committee. The committee has not met yet.

G. Kiwanis Presidential Scholarships. Scott Youngberg stated that there were four scholarship recipients so far-- two from each high school (Atlantic and American Heritage), with the possibility of awarding two more. The question was raised if Atlantic High had paid their Florida Key Club dues - that detail will have to be confirmed. Dave Freeburn volunteered to be a liaison with the schools for the Key Club program. Joel Davidson asked if there would be an awards presentation. Scott responded that club members used to present the awards to the students in person but that hasn't occurred lately. A Key Club chairman is needed to re-energize communications with the schools and students.

H. Golf Tournament. Scott reported that the event is progressing, and organizer Linda Brown would give an update at Wednesday's club meeting.

I. Kiwanis Shirt Order. Scott said that the order had been placed but there is a backlog of shirts and delivery was delayed.

J. Interclub meeting with Boca Kiwanis Club. Members of the Boca club have been invited to attend our Wednesday club meeting (June 11). FAU President Adam Hasner will be the speaker.

K. Budget/Calendar of Events. Jay said that he and Bill Morse are hoping to have a budget completed by September, along with the calendar of events.

VI. New Business:

A. Education Breakfast . Rich Pollack stated that it will cost \$450.00 to sponsor the event, which will secure a table for ten (10). He thought we might be able to get two tables. The event is August 28th at the city's golf club. As proposed the Kiwanis Club would contribute \$25.00 per person and attendees would contribute \$20.00 each. Motion to approve sponsorship of Education Breakfast . Motion made by Rich Pollock. Seconded by Bill Morse. Approved unanimously

Why Do We Say "Bless You" When Someone Sneezes?



Sternutation, the medical term for sneezing, is a sudden, forceful, involuntary burst of air through the nose and mouth. It can be triggered by irritants in the nose or throat, environmental allergies, or viral upper respiratory infections. Some people even experience photic sneezing, which is sneezing in response to bright light, such as sunlight. The condition is formally known as autosomal dominant compelling helio ophthalmic outburst syndrome. That's right, ACHOO syndrome.

Regardless of the reason for a sneeze, the polite response is commonly "bless you" or "God bless you." Unlike with other bodily functions, particularly the closely associated cough, it is considered poor manners to let a sneeze go unanswered. Saying "bless you" is such an expected social custom that *not* saying it can lead to an awkward and uncomfortable silence, which might explain why a singular sneeze can garner several blessings from people nearby. The question is, why exactly is the phrase "bless you" the standard response to a sneeze?

A Prayer To Protect the Soul

For most of history, and before the advent of modern medicine in the late 19th century, life could be brutally brief. Globally, the average life expectancy of a newborn in 1900 was just 32 years. By 2021, the number had more than doubled to 71 years. Death took many forms, but infectious diseases, including bubonic plague and influenza, could wipe out entire communities in a matter of months. So any outward sign of illness, such as sneezing, was reason for concern — and in turn, prayer. Membership

It's important to know the signs of a Medicare scam so you can protect yourself. To get your personal information, like your Medicare number, **scammers may call, text and email saying things like:**

"You need to activate or renew your Medicare card." "We'd like to send you a free genetic testing kit." "Medicare has authorized us to send you a free (knee, back or elbow) brace."

"You qualify for a refund on your Medicare costs."

Remember, **never give your Medicare card or number to anyone** except your doctor or people you know should have it.

Keep in mind: Caller IDs and email addresses can be faked, so if you're not sure who's calling, **call Medicare at 1-800-MEDICARE** (1-800-633-4227). And remember, Medicare will never contact you unless you've contacted us first.

To help spot and prevent Medicare fraud and abuse:

Compare the dates and services on your calendar with the Medicare statements you get to make sure you got each service listed and that all the details are correct.

Protect your personal information and become familiar with how Medicare uses it.

Know what a Medicare health or drug plan can and can't do before you join. If you join a Medicare health or drug plan, the plan will let you know how it will use your personal information.

June 4:

1812, the U.S. House of Representatives passed its first war declaration, approving by a vote of 79-49 a declaration of war against Britain.

1919, Congress approved the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which said that the right of Americans to vote "shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex." (The amendment was then sent

to the states for ratification.) 1940, during World War II, the Allied military completed the evacuation of more than 338,000 troops from Dunkirk, France.

1940, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill declared in a speech to the House of Commons: "We shall fight on the beaches, we shall fight on the landing grounds, we shall fight in the fields and in the streets, we shall fight in the hills; we shall never surrender."

1942, the World War II naval Battle of Midway began, which resulted in a decisive American victory against Japan and marked a turning point in the war in the Pacific.

1990, Dr. Jack Kevorkian carried out his first publicly assisted suicide, helping Janet Adkins, a 54-year-old Alzheimer's patient from Portland, Oregon, end her life in Oakland County, Michigan.

1998, a federal judge sentenced Terry Nichols to life in prison without parole for his role in the 1995 bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City, which killed 168 people.

1776, the Second Continental Congress appointed the Committee of Five (composed of John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, Robert Livingston and Roger Sherman) to draft a declaration of independence from Great

Britain, to be completed in the subsequent 17 days. 1955, in motor racing's worst disaster, more than 80 people were killed during the 24 Hours of Le Mans in France when two cars collided and crashed into

spectators. 1962, Frank Morris, Clarence Anglin and John Anglin, prisoners at Alcatraz Federal Penitentiary in San Francisco Bay, staged an escape, leaving the island on a makeshift raft; they were never found or heard from again.

1963, the University of Alabama was desegregated as Vivian Malone and James Hood became the first two Black students allowed to enroll in classes. 1987, Margaret Thatcher became the first British prime minister in over 160

years to win a third consecutive term of office as her Conservative Party held onto a reduced majority in Parliament.

2009, with swine flu reported in more than 70 nations, the World Health Organization declared the first global flu pandemic in 41 years.

1876, the Battle of the Little Bighorn, also known as Custer's Last Stand, began in southeastern Montana Territory. As many as 100 Native Americans were killed in the battle, as were 268 people attached to the 7th Cavalry Regiment, including

In the battle, as were 268 people attached to the 7th Cavalry Regiment, including George Armstrong Custer and Mark Kellogg, the first Associated Press reporter to die in the line of duty. 1938, the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, which set a minimum wage, guaranteed overtime pay and banned "oppressive child labor," was signed into law by President Franklin D. Roosevelt. 1947, "The Diary of a Young Girl," the personal journal of Anne Frank, a Germanborn Jewish girl hiding with her family from the Nazis in Amsterdam during World War II, was first published.

1950, war broke out in Korea as forces from the communist North invaded the South. The conflict would last for over three years and would be responsible for an estimated 4 million deaths, an estimated 3 million of whom were civilians. 1973, former White House Counsel John Dean began testifying before the Senate Watergate Committee, implicating top administration officials, including President Richard Nixon as well as himself, in the Watergate scandal and cover-up. 2021, former Minneapolis police Officer Derek Chauvin was sentenced to 22 1/2 years in prison for the murder of George Floyd, whose death led to the biggest outcry against racial injustice in the U.S. in generations.
