Providing Trust in PBC Government

Our program on July 1st was presented by S. Lizabeth Martin, Education & Communications Manager for the Palm Beach County Commission on Ethics. Their mission is to foster integrity in public services, to promote the public's trust and confidence in that service, and to prevent conflicts between private interests and public duties.

Established to prevent conflicts between private interests and public duties, the commission handles investigations, enforces gift laws, and provides clear, timely advisory opinions to local government officials.

The COE was formed in the wake of a series of high-profile political scandals in Palm Beach County in the late 2000s, which devastated public

trust. Since its inception, the agency has issued over 500 advisory opinions and operates under the motto "Ask first, act later," encouraging officials to seek guidance before taking actions that might raise ethical concerns.

Operating out of West Palm Beach, Florida, the COE's scope covers Palm Beach County as well as its 39 municipalities. The five-appointed-member commission relies on investigations and community outreach to help ensure that public service remains a public trust.

Protect Yourself From Scams & Frauds



Our program on July 8th was presented by Mike Caruso, Clerk of the Court & Controller for Palm Beach County. The Clerk is our public trustee, responsible for safeguarding public records and taxpayer money. The Florida Constitution established the Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller as a constitutional officer, directly elected by and accountable to the people of Palm Beach County.

Mike Caruso and his entire team are Here to Help protect you against scams. They want to make sure you're on the lookout for three types of scams targeting people throughout Palm Beach County and Florida each day: Traffic ticket scams, jury duty scams, and property deed theft.

The United States Internet Crime Complaint Center reported that South Floridians lost more than \$12 million

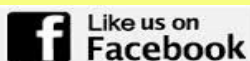
to impersonation scams last year. The best way to protect yourself is to spot the signs. "If you're in doubt, don't give your info out".

Mike is urging all Palm Beach County property owners to take a minute and ensure their most valuable assets are protected by the Clerk's free Property Fraud Alert service.

Subscribers to the Clerk's Property Fraud Alert service will in most cases receive an email alert within 24 hours if a document such as a deed or mortgage is recorded with the Clerk's office that matches the information used on their Property Fraud Alert registration.

Subscribers can then notify authorities if they suspect something was recorded without their knowledge or permission.

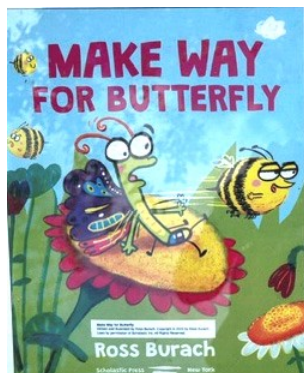
Our club is paying \$500 toward the cost of two tables at the Education Breakfast on August 27th. Contact **Ezra Krieg** if you would like to attend.

"The Clerk's Property Fraud Alert service is our community's first line of defense against the growing crime of deed fraud," Clerk Caruso said. "It only takes two minutes to register online for Property Fraud Alert and can help you protect your home for years to come."

Jury Duty Scam: Palm Beach County residents are being targeted by scammers who claim they missed jury duty and demand payment over the phone to "avoid arrest," according to reports received by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

PBSO emphasized that these calls may sound official, but they are not legitimate. "PBSO will NEVER call and ask for money," the sheriff's office stated. They advised anyone receiving such a call to hang up and report it to the authorities, stressing that it is a scam.

Traffic Ticket Fraud: With traffic ticket fraud, criminals send a text or email claiming your actual unpaid traffic ticket (all information is public record) must be paid online, often including a suspicious link to an unverified payment site.

What can I do to protect myself from traffic ticket fraud? Do not click or tap links in unsolicited messages. Watch for threats of arrest, requests for payment via gift cards or wire transfers, pressure to act quickly and unexpected text messages. Never give out personal or financial information to unsolicited callers. Never give out your Social Security number.

What to do if you think you may be a victim of fraud: Act quickly! Report fraud to the appropriate law enforcement agency based on where you live and where the fraud happened.

Improving The Lives of PBC Children & Families

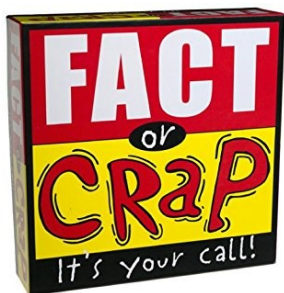


Our program on July 15th was presented by Jon Burstein, Communications Specialist for the Children's Services Council. The Council is a local, special-purpose government created by Palm Beach County voters in 1986 and reauthorized in 2014. For more than 40 years, it has provided leadership, funding, services and research on behalf of the county's children so they grow up healthy, safe and strong.

Children's Services Council funds nearly 60 programs that provide direct services to families through their System of Care model. From pregnancy through the teen years, raising healthy, safe and strong children is tough for any family. CSC is here to help. They fund programs and services for pregnant women, families with infants and children under 6, afterschool and summer programs for school-age children, and mentoring and other programs for teens.

CSC also fund initiatives that provide an array of services and supports to all Palm Beach County families, including Drowning Prevention, Fetal and Infant Mortality, Food Insecurity, Legal Advocacy, Mentoring and Safety/Injury Prevention.

Reporting Cash Payments

Individuals, companies, corporations, and others must report cash transactions of more than \$10,000. These cash payments can include jewelry sales, gifts from family members, overseas purchases, or any other cash transactions. You also need to report cash payments received in one lump sum, in two or more related payments within 24 hours, or as part of a single transaction or two or more transactions in the previous year.

All you need to do is file Form 8300, Report of Cash Payments Over \$10,000 Received in a Trade or Business. The form requires information about the giver and the recipient of the cash, a description of the transaction, and details about any other parties involved.

IRS Tips for tracking charitable donations

Taxpayers who have made or plan to make charitable donations during the year should keep good records of all their contributions. Organized records can make tax filing easier and help support a deduction if it's claimed on a federal tax return.

Here are some tips to help taxpayers keep track of charitable donations:

General deduction rules. Generally, taxpayers must itemize deductions on [Schedule A \(Form 1040\), Itemized Deductions](#) to claim a deduction for charitable contributions. However, beginning with tax year 2026, [taxpayers who do not itemize may be able to deduct up to \\$1,000 in cash contributions, or \\$2,000 for married taxpayers filing jointly](#), made to certain qualified organizations.

Know what qualifies. Donations to individuals are not deductible. Examples of this include gifts or individual fundraising accounts. Taxpayers can use the [Tax Exempt Organization Search](#) tool on IRS.gov to verify whether an organization is eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions.

Keep proof of all cash donations. For any cash, check or other monetary gifts, taxpayers should keep a bank record or written communication from the charitable organization showing the organization's name, the date of the contribution and the amount donated.

Get a written acknowledgment for larger donations. Contributions of **\$250 or more**, cash or property, require a written acknowledgment from the qualified organization before the deduction can be claimed. The documentation must include the amount of cash or description of the property. It also must state if the organization provided any goods or services in exchange for the gift. If so, description and a good faith estimate of the value of those goods or services must be provided.

Maintain records for non-cash donations. Taxpayers should keep records describing donated property and its fair market value. Additional documentation, including [Form 8283, Noncash Charitable Contributions](#), and a qualified appraisal may be required for larger noncash donations.

Special rules apply to donations of certain types of property such as automobiles, inventory and certain other readily valued property. For more information, refer to [Publication 526](#). For information on determining the value of noncash contributions, refer to [Publication 561](#).

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



July1:

1867, Canada became a self-governing dominion of Great Britain as the British North America Act took effect. Called Dominion Day until 1982, the national holiday is now known as Canada Day.
1863, the pivotal, three-day Civil War Battle of Gettysburg, resulting in a Union victory, began in Pennsylvania.
1903, the first Tour de France began. (It ended on July 19, won by Maurice Garin.)
1944, delegates from 44 countries began meeting at Bretton Woods, New Hampshire, where they agreed to establish the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank.
1963, the U.S. Post Office inaugurated its five-digit ZIP codes.
1973, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration was established.
1984, the first movie rated PG-13 ("Red Dawn," starring Patrick Swayze) was released.
1997, Hong Kong reverted to Chinese rule after 156 years as a British colony.
2019, 15-year-old Coco Gauff, the youngest player to qualify at Wimbledon in the professional era, defeated 39-year-old Venus Williams in the first round.

July8:

1776, Col. John Nixon gave the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence, outside the State House (now Independence Hall) in Philadelphia.
1853, an expedition led by U.S. Commodore Matthew Perry arrived in Edo Bay, Japan, on a mission to seek diplomatic and trade relations with the Japanese.
1889, the first issue of The Wall Street Journal was published.
1947, a New Mexico newspaper, the Roswell Daily Record, quoted officials at Roswell Army Air Field as saying they had recovered a "flying saucer" that crashed onto a ranch; officials then said it was actually a weather balloon.
1950, President Harry S. Truman named Gen. Douglas MacArthur commander-in-chief of United Nations forces in Korea. (Truman would fire MacArthur for insubordination nine months later.)
2000, Venus Williams beat Lindsay Davenport for her first Grand Slam title, becoming the first Black female champion at Wimbledon since Althea Gibson in 1958.
2011, the 135th and final space shuttle mission began when space shuttle Atlantis launched from Kennedy Space Center.
2018, divers rescued four of the 12 boys who had been trapped in a flooded cave in northern Thailand with their soccer coach for more than two weeks. (The remaining eight boys and their coach were rescued over the next two days.)

1799, the Rosetta Stone, a key to deciphering ancient Egyptian scripts, was found at Fort Julien in the Nile Delta during the Napoleonic campaign in Egypt.
1834, the Spanish Inquisition was abolished more than 350 years after its creation.
1870, Georgia became the last Confederate state to be readmitted to the Union.
1913, Democrat Augustus Bacon of Georgia became the first person elected to the U.S. Senate under the terms of the recently ratified 17th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, providing for popular election of senators.
1916, The Boeing Company, originally known as Pacific Aero Products Co., was founded in Seattle.
1975, three American astronauts blasted off aboard an Apollo spacecraft hours after two Soviet cosmonauts were launched aboard a Soyuz spacecraft for a mission that included a linkup of the two ships in orbit.
1996, MSNBC, a 24-hour all-news network, made its debut on cable and the internet.
2006, Twitter (now known as X) was launched to the public.

1933, aviator Wiley Post landed at Floyd Bennett Field in New York City, completing the first solo flight around the world in 7 days, 18 hours and 49 minutes.
1934, bank robber John Dillinger was shot to death by federal agents outside Chicago's Biograph Theater, where he had just seen the Clark Gable movie "Manhattan Melodrama."
1943, American forces led by Gen. George S. Patton captured Palermo, Sicily, during World War II.
1975, the House of Representatives joined the Senate in voting to restore the American citizenship of Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee.
1991, police in Milwaukee arrested Jeffrey Dahmer, who later confessed to killing 17 men and boys. (Dahmer was sentenced to life in prison and was killed by another inmate in 1994).
2022, Steve Bannon, a longtime ally of Donald Trump, was convicted of contempt charges for defying a congressional subpoena from the House committee investigating the Jan. 6 insurrection at the U.S. Capitol. (After challenging his conviction, Bannon served a four-month prison sentence in 2024 and was released.)

1914, transcontinental telephone service in the U.S. became operational with the first test conversation between New York and San Francisco.
1954, the first volume of JRR Tolkien's novel "The Lord of the Rings" ("The Fellowship of the Ring") was published.
1957, the International Atomic Energy Agency was established.
1958, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the National Aeronautics and Space Act, creating NASA.
1981, Britain's Prince Charles married Lady Diana Spencer in a glittering ceremony at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. (They divorced in 1996.)

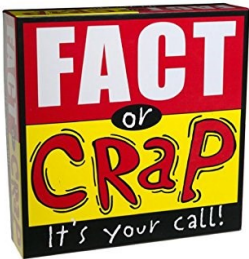
