Founded in 2016 by the mother of a special needs child with serious, chronic medical issues, Extraordinary Kids Foundation has served more than 700 children. They were established to address the growing need for quality childcare

services for children with medical conditions and special needs.

EKF also runs the EKF Provision Center providing essential resources including nutritious food, clothing, and supplies to those in need. Their center also offers hot showers every Saturday 11am-1pm and hygiene services to restore dignity and comfort. They also host health screenings to promote wellness and connect individuals with vital support systems.

Our program on May 20th was presented by Annette Gray, President/Founder of GBDC Entrepreneurship Institute.

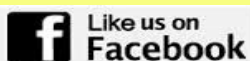

Our club's recent Board Meeting took place via Zoom on May 4th. Here are the notes:

I. Board Attendance: President Diane Colonna, Vice-President Pam Davidson, Secretary Alperin. Treasurer Morse. Past President Dave Freeburn. Directors: Kelleher, J Davidson, Krieg, Sablo,

Schroeder.

II. Foundation Attendance : President Colonna, Vice-President Pollack; Secretary Alperin, Treasurer Morse, Directors: PDavidson, Youngberg, Freeburn.

III. Secretary's Report: Minutes from April 6, 2026 meeting. Motion to accept minutes, Davidson/Morse. Passed.

IV. Financial Report: Bill reported that the Club account is at \$7,851.00 and the Foundation balance is \$ 26,187.68. Motion to approve the Financial Report made by P. Davidson, Second - B. Morse; Passed unanimously

V. Old Business:

1. Delray Beach 250th US Birthday Celebration - (Peggy) . Peggy reported that the flyer is nearly complete and a QR code has been obtained, with plans to reach out to sculptors and nonprofits for participation. The city is handling permits, making it a city event run by Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs. Joel inquired about additional July 4th activities beyond the sculpture event, to which Peggy explained the scale of the downtown celebration and the significant effort required.

2. Delray Citizens for Delray Police Event (Cont'd from April 6). Rich explaining that the proposed donation of \$500 was for scholarships for police officers' children. A motion was made by Peggy to approve the \$500 scholarship donation and seconded by Bill, which passed unanimously.

3. Happy Hour May 14th (Peggy). The conversation ended with plans for upcoming happy hours, with one scheduled for May 14th from 5-7 PM, and plans to hold additional events in June, July, August, and October to accommodate the off-season schedule.

4. Trivia Night. Ezra provided an update on Trivia Night, reporting 16 people signed up with room for 20, and mentioned they would pass around the sheet again at Wednesday's meeting to reach the full capacity.

VI. New Business:

1. Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections Adopt-A-Precinct Program (Ezra). Ezra noted 7 people signed up with a goal of 14 and mentioned that participants don't need to be Kiwanians to participate. The discussion also covered the deputy dog roles for the event, with Reeves and Marsha confirmed for these positions.

2. Kiwanis Club Election of Officers (Scott). Scott reported on four openings for two-year directors and three openings for foundation directors. The group discussed potential candidates including Nick Coppola and Ronnie Dunayer. When asked about running again, Diane agreed to serve if no other candidates stepped forward, and the group humorously offered to double her salary to encourage her to run.

3. Teacher Appreciation Week (Ezra). The group discussed Teacher Appreciation Week and agreed to find ways to participate, with Ezra volunteering to reach out to Danielle (principal) to determine the number of teachers at Orchard View. They also learned that Danielle will be leaving her position and moving to Del Prado in Boca, with a new principal yet to be named. The group considered organizing a continental breakfast to acknowledge both current and departing staff, and discussed the importance of establishing a relationship with the incoming principal.

4. Plumosa Elementary Funding Request Rejection. The Mayor's office forwarded to Kiwanis a letter he received from Plumosa Elementary, requesting funding to purchase prizes for students who meet or exceed academic targets. The prizes would be gift cards and game consoles. The consensus was to decline the request as it did not align with the club's funding criteria or mission. Rich agreed to communicate this decision to Tom,

VII. Other:

1. Ezra noted Scott's work on the latest newsletter, which was commended for its quality journalism and photography.

2. The group discussed plans for a "Walk with the Chief" event at the end of May, with Ezra offering to contact the police chief about potentially incorporating a visit to the story trail at Barwick. Joel reported positive feedback about the story trail from community members and proposed adding signage to help direct visitors.

3. The group also briefly discussed the upcoming golf tournament scheduled for October 24th at Indian Springs, with Scott noting that course improvements at Delray were running behind schedule and likely wouldn't be completed until early 2027.

Celebrating Individuality and Growth

Our program on May 27th was presented by Stephen Gaskill, President of the Acceptance Academy Foundation.

The Acceptance Academy Foundation is a non-profit organization that manages and oversees the Acceptance Academy Community School (AACS), a private, non-profit middle school for students who have difficulty fitting into

the school environment because they are bullied for who they are or because they live in a non-traditional home.

Studies show bullying can lead to substance abuse, poor self esteem and lower academic performance. The AACS is a welcoming place that encourages students to indulge in self-expression and intellectual curiosity to ensure they grow into well-adjusted teens.

The AACS is located in Boca Raton, and launched in January 2026 with classes of 6th, 7th and 8th graders. As interest grows and finances and circumstances allow, they will add more classes and additional grades. They welcome students from across the region.

The curriculum of the AACS focuses on project-based learning. This method ensures that their students develop knowledge and skills through engaging projects set around problems and challenges they may face in the real world. Their students design hands-on solutions to problems in a dynamic atmosphere, while meeting state-specific educational benchmarks for their grade level.

The AACS values the unique contributions each student brings to the classroom. They expect their students' parents or guardians to assist in setting learning goals and participating in decisions that affect them. 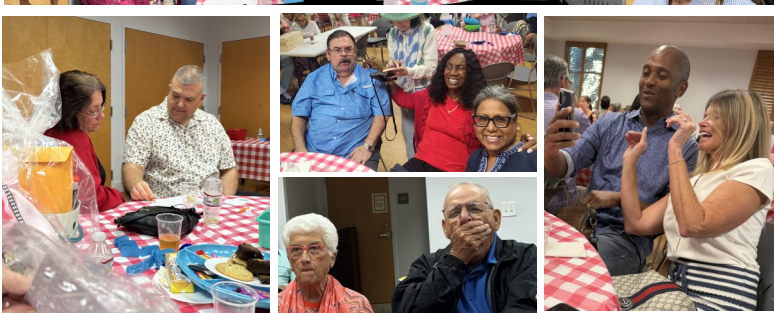

Four Tips to Help You Sleep Better

Sleep is one of the most important things we do to stay healthy and energized. Much more goes into getting a good night's sleep than simply resting your head on the pillow, so here are some tips for getting your shut-eye:

- Increase bright light exposure during the day. You probably already know that it helps to keep your room dark while you sleep, but did you know it's also beneficial to get enough bright light during the day? These contrasts tell your body when it's time to go to sleep. This natural clock is called your circadian rhythm.
- Reduce blue light exposure in the evening. The blue light emitted by our devices (smartphones, tablets, and TVs) can disrupt your sleep cycle. Try to limit blue light at least two hours before bedtime. Some devices offer a setting that automatically "warms" the light to limit these blue hues.
- Try to wake up and sleep consistently, even on weekends, as this is another way to set up your body's circadian rhythm for success.
- Adjust your bedroom temperature. Did you know that the temperature in your bedroom can affect your sleep? Some studies show that temperature matters even more than noise.

Social media can be a quick and easy way to get tax-related updates, especially with the many updates from the [One, Big, Beautiful Bill](#). But not all online tax advice is accurate. Scammers and misinformation are common on social media. That's why it's important for taxpayers to follow official IRS social media accounts and subscribe to e-News updates, for the most reliable information.

IRS social media platforms

Visit [IRS.gov](#) to get direct links to [IRS verified social media accounts](#). IRS has accounts on:

- **X** – Tax-related information for individuals, businesses, and tax professionals. A special IRS X handle, @IRStaxsecurity, shares information to help people avoid common scams
- **Facebook** – Tax information and event announcements for a general audience
- **Instagram** – Taxpayer-friendly information on a variety of topics such as tax law changes, reminders and scam info
- **YouTube** – Short videos on specific tax topics for individual taxpayers, tax professionals and small businesses. Webinars are also available to explain more complex tax topics.
- **LinkedIn** – Key agency communications including job announcements

The IRS **never** contacts taxpayers on social media to ask for their personal or financial information. Taxpayers should be aware [scammers may pose as the IRS](#) to steal a taxpayer's identity or defraud them. To stay informed, be sure to follow, like and subscribe.

Additionally, even though filing season has wrapped up, there's a lot of tax related misinformation on social media. Don't be tempted by these viral "tax hacks" that often encourage taxpayers to file returns with false information or claim credits they don't qualify for.

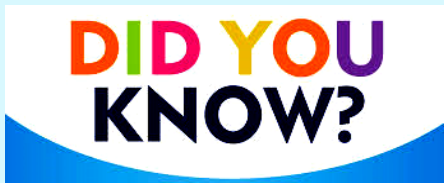

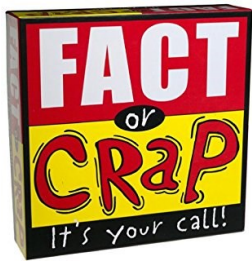

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past month:

May 6:

1882, President Chester Alan Arthur signed the Chinese Exclusion Act, which barred Chinese laborers from immigrating to the U.S. for 10 years. (The act would remain in effect until 1943.)
1889, the Eiffel Tower opened to the public as part of the Paris World's Fair.
1935, the Works Progress Administration was established under an executive order signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt.
1937, the hydrogen-filled German airship Hindenburg caught fire and crashed while attempting to dock at Lakehurst, New Jersey; 35 of the 97 people on board and one crew member on the ground were killed.
1954, medical student Roger Bannister broke the four-minute mile at a track meet in Oxford, England, finishing in 3:59.4.
1994, the Channel Tunnel connecting England and France beneath the English Channel was officially opened in a ceremony attended by Queen Elizabeth II and French President François Mitterrand.
2023, King Charles III was crowned at Westminster Abbey in a grandiose ceremony replete with pomp and ritual. Charles was the 40th sovereign enthroned in the abbey — and, at 74, the oldest.

May 13:

1846, the United States Congress formally declared war against Mexico, following battles along the disputed U.S.-Mexico border in the preceding weeks; the Mexican-American War would continue for nearly two years until the signing of the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo in February 1848.
1973, in tennis' first so-called "Battle of the Sexes," Bobby Riggs defeated Margaret Court 6-2, 6-1 in Ramona, California. (Billie Jean King soundly defeated Riggs at the Houston Astrodome later that year.)
1981, Pope John Paul II was shot and seriously wounded in St. Peter's Square by Turkish assailant Mehmet Ali Ağca. (Ağca was sentenced to life in prison in Italy in July 1981, but was pardoned in 2000 at the Pope's request.)
1995, British climber Alison Hargreaves became the first woman to reach the summit of Mount Everest, the world's tallest mountain, without bottled oxygen or the help of sherpas.
2016, the Obama administration issued a directive requiring public schools to permit transgender students to use bathrooms and locker rooms consistent with their chosen gender identity.

May 20:

1861, North Carolina seceded from the Union, becoming the 10th state to join the Confederacy early in the American Civil War.
1862, President Abraham Lincoln signed the Homestead Act, which was intended to encourage settlement west of the Mississippi River by making federal land available for private ownership and farming.
1873, Levi Strauss and Jacob Davis obtained a U.S. patent for putting rivets in men's work pants to prevent wear and tear, leading to the large-scale production of denim blue jeans.
1927, Charles Lindbergh took off from Long Island, New York, aboard the Spirit of St. Louis on his historic solo flight to Paris, France. He completed the first solo, nonstop transatlantic flight of more than 3,600 miles (5,800 kilometers) in just over 33 hours.
1948, Chiang Kai-shek was elected as the first president of the Republic of China (Taiwan).
1956, the United States exploded the first airborne hydrogen bomb over Bikini Atoll in the Pacific.
1969, U.S. and South Vietnamese forces captured Ap Bia Mountain, referred to as "Hamburger Hill" by the Americans, following one of the bloodiest battles of the Vietnam War.
2015, four of the world's biggest banks — JPMorgan Chase, Citigroup's banking unit Citicorp, Barclays and the Royal Bank of Scotland — agreed to plead guilty to rigging the currency markets and pay more than \$5 billion in penalties.

May 27:

1930, New York's Chrysler Building, at the time the world's tallest building, opened to the public.
1937, the newly completed Golden Gate Bridge connecting San Francisco and Marin County, California, was opened to pedestrian traffic (vehicles began crossing the next day).
1941, the British Royal Navy sank the German battleship Bismarck off France, killing over 2,000 German sailors.
1942, Doris "Dorie" Miller, a cook aboard the USS West Virginia, became the first African American to receive the Navy Cross for displaying "extraordinary courage and disregard for his own personal safety" during Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor.
1968, the U.S. Supreme Court, in United States v. O'Brien, upheld the conviction of David O'Brien for destroying his draft card outside a Boston courthouse, ruling that the act was not protected by freedom of speech.
1994, Nobel Prize-winning author Alexander Solzhenitsyn returned to Russia to the emotional cheers of thousands after spending two decades in exile.
