Program:

Wayne Zipser, Executive Director and Tom Orvis, Governmental Affairs Director of the Stanislaus County Farm Bureau were todays program. The Farm Bureau, established in 1914 is celebrating their 106th anniversary. They serve as the voice of Stanislaus County agriculture at all levels of government, while providing programs to assist its farms and family members and educate the general public of needs and importance to agriculture.

Mr. Zipser said the Farm Bureau works day in and day out to ensure that agriculture remains a viable industry with a bright future for generations to come. They work to educate consumers about the value of agriculture and those hands that produce the food we eat and take pride in helping the next generation of agriculturalists have the tools they need to succeed.

Mr. Orvis noted the Farm Bureau champions agriculture at every level of government to ensure that farmers have a strong voice that is heard when needed most. His family has been ranching in our area for over 150 years.

Mr. Zipser talked about the farmers role in the COVID-19 pandemic. Our local farmers donated thousands of PPE supplies to our hospitals early on (gloves, N95 masks, etc.) They worked to keep the farm workers safe and keep the food supply chain moving. The industry is working on 'robotics' for the future, which could eliminate the 'health safety' issues for humans.



The almond industry is still growing, up 21% over last year, which was a record year. With our great climate and rich soil, Stanislaus County grows over 250 products.

Mr. Orvis discussed water and water rights and the challenges we face, "2021 will be a very interesting year in the water world". He reviewed the Oakdale Irrigation District (where he is president) and the Modesto Irrigation District. Farmers are the best stewards of land and water. Very informative presentation by both speakers.
