PROGRAM

Introduction by Judy Herrero of Donna Linder, Stanislaus Registrar of Voters.

We have some new laws.

- Extend ability to get marriage and death cents by mail.
- Transfer on Death is extended to 2032.
- Restrictive covenants will be reviewed and redacted. Remove race and gender illegal covenants. Start with 1989 to current.
- Elections. Any vacancy for US senator used to be appointed but will now need to be on an election and if necessary an expensive special election.
- Governor candidates must provide tax returns.
- SOS shall establish a ballot tracking system to add another level of certainty to the process.
- AB 37. Vote by mail to everyone 29 days before election. Extends time that a ballot is accepted from 3 to 7 days after Election Day if postmarked by Election Day.

Construction of new offices is going on.

A new system has been purchased with self-serve kiosks for online entry.

More ballot boxes around county.

Processing can start 29 days before election, if ballots are received.

54% voted in the recent recall election.

To return a vote by mail ballot you can put in mail, ballot box, voting center or vote in person.



Vote by mail tracking system is available to check your ballot has been counted.

Procedure: Get envelope in mail, there is a box on the back to check if you make a mistake and want a new ballot, if there is time. Sign your ballot. Hole in the envelope is to help the visually impaired, NOT to let people peek!

Office goes to great lengths to correct inconsistencies, but it is time consuming. The envelope you use for a ballot should be the correct envelope that was sent for this election, to you; not your spouse!

Polling places and voting centers are different. Voting centers offer all services but polling places only allow you to vote.

Drive thru voting is available if needed.

Locations will be open 10 days before the election. 8 to 5 Monday thru Friday except Election Day itself which is 7am to 8pm.

Remote access Vote by Mail is now available to anyone who wishes to use it.

Only one ballot is allowed per envelope. If more than one ballot is submitted in an envelope, then none can be counted. Attempts to submit multiple submissions are not allowed and are illegal.

Your Signature is checked. Envelopes are sorted by precinct. The Ballot is opened and not connected to your name. Votes are counted.

Election is audited. Random 1% audit of ballots to check the computer count.

New registrations are checked to confirm they have not voted elsewhere.

Drop boxes are secured and video surveillance if outside.

Drop box pickup with identifiable workers and processes for security.
