Kara is the Assistant Learning Director and graduated with a degree in German. She studied Literacy training. She has two sons, both special ed teachers. Kara has been here for 35 years.

Many Tri Valley employees needed reading help. Stanislaus Literacy centerwas created with the Family literacy program.

The organization is a non profit with funding thru state library and Stan county Sheriff Department and Stan co welfare to work program. There are services in Patterson and Newman. Classes are offered in English and Spanish. The aim is to get students to the level that they can pass the HSE (High School Equivalency exam) which is the new versions of GED.

There is Leading Quest for adults and Kids Quest for kids. 2nd thru 6th grade.

What is literacy? Functionally illiterate...can do the minimum. Around 5th to 6th grade comprehension level.

Learning Quest offers one on one tutoring for adult learners. Family literacy and ESL programs, Parent support class, Hybrid live and online classes.

They are looking for volunteers. 3 hr per week. Call Kara Lewis 209 262 0961 at Learning Quest. Tutors needed for Math as well as languages.

Adelaida, 24 years old , dropped out of school in 8th grade. Worked. Had son while a teen. Moved to Tijuana. Worked long hours. Came to Salinas and worked minimum wage jobs. Wanted to make something of herself. Did medical assistant class in San Jose. Graduated and got certificate. Wants to become a public defender so needed a high school diploma. She took classes in Spanish at night, had a second child, and then Covid came, the tests looked daunting. Her teacher encouraged her and she passed the tests. Finally succeeded in math too. Surprised and happy and got her HSE.

Learning Quest is building hope and offering scholarship.
