They teamed up to talk about Stanislaus 2030, a new regional strategy to improve economic prosperity of Stanislaus County by creating new industries aligned around our ag base and developing workforce training. The goal is to have many more jobs that provide livable wages with benefits.

Bookings institute has been a partner in the work. Its research shows that half of our families are struggling economically. Only 13 percent of the jobs are classified as good jobs, 23 percent as promising and 64 percent are poor jobs. We need 40,000 more good jobs. Stanislaus need to focus on traded sector business. Needs to support businesses in this sector. Needs to solve the barriers in this area such as education and childcare.
