Steve started with a story about the last speaker at a convention who whose subject was sexuality and his entire speech was 'it gives me great pleasure'.

Ed Jenner, 1798 invented the smallpox vaccine from cowpox. 30% mortality. Even in 19th century it was 10%. Smallpox was actually eliminated in 1970.

Now we also have no cases of polio in the last 6 months.

In 20th century there are 16 common vaccines.

We are working on malaria.

150 million killed by war.

300 million saved by vaccines.

Article in te British medical journal Lancet suggested a link between measles vaccine and autism. Peer review disproved the theory. The authors work was later proved untrue. Started the anti immunization movement.

Operation warp speed worked great. Developed Covid vaccine quickly without cutting corners.
