PROGRAM

Councilor Williams introduced our speaker John Ervin.

John's day job is with Road Warrior Logistics awho does sub contract deliveries for Amazon.

John is here today to talk about 'Project Uplift' which is a mentoring program for youth empowerment. Originally came to Modesto in the youth conservation corps in Modesto. Cleaning up parks, working with maintenance staff. Recruited by Modesto City Schools to run after school, programs. Ran the first federally funded after school program in the county.

Ninety nine school districts in the nation had federally funded programs and Modesto was one. African American boys had disproportionally high rates of suspension and discipline. So, john started project uplift to mentor boys, especially African American.

Wanted to pinpoint the reasons that negative things started to happen in their lives. Realized that once students get behind in credits it is easy for them to end up dropping out.

Mentoring is most effective one to one, up to one to four mentor to students.

Good results. 100 % graduation rates, attendance improved, discipline rates went down.

Took the students down to Compton college in Los Angeles for leadership conferences. Conference grew large enough to be moved to USC. Extended the conference to include a fatherhood and motherhood conference to try to develop family units that could be successful.

Many success stories including two students who became a counsellor in Monterey and an LA PD Officer.

Mentoring works. They had an interruption during Covid but now the program is rebuilding as mentoring works.

John is now involved in training other mentors and promoting the program all over the country.

Has worked with boys from juvenile hall. Will identify kids in need from 4th grade onward.

Currently 10 kids in the program and they could handle 20. Plenty of candidates and he is now working through the qualifying procedure and talking to parents.
