Grew up in Cuba, came to the USA at the age of 17.

Came to Modesto as a VP of instruction at MJC. Hired by Steve Collins.

PROGRAM:

Harrison Power introduced our speaker today, Gavin Bruce, the Conservation management Officer for East Stanislaus Resource Conservation District.

RCDs are generally in every county in Ca. Stanislaus has 2, eats and west. Red started in the 30's and the dust bowl to perform soil conservation and best practice farming to prevent a repeat of the dust bowl.

East Stan RCD has been around since 1996. Information on ag and gardens and nutrition. Sustainable Ag.

Irrigation assessments.

Field trials on composting to find best practices.

Work with Xerces society on hedgerows and insect populations.

Community programs . SLEWS program works with local high schools. Hands on trips to locals sites.

Farm to pantry program. Try to increase the level of fresh produce in the county.

Junior chef program at junior highs to introduce them to salads and fruits and vegetables.

Pollinator program with local farmers. 70% of crops need pollinators. 90% of flowering plants. Bees, butterflies, wasps, moths, beetles, and even rodents.

Declining pollinator populations. Over 1600 different species of bees. Most are solitary. Some burrow into the soil. Some build nests. Some burrow into wood.

Monarch butterfly population has declined by 99% in the last decade. Very dependent on milkweed plant and as milkweed has declined due to farming and herbicides, the butterfly population has declines. We are now trying to get more milkweed. Except that Tropical milkweed has some issues so prefer other varieties.

Support pollinators by planting native plants which are well adapted to our dry climate. Native insects and animals are codependent on native plants os it all works well.providing nesting areas helps too; leaving some leaf litter or small rock piles. Refrain from herbicides and pesticides as far as possible. Avoid plants that have been treated with 'systemics' as they may poison the insects that eat them.

California Native Plant Society has a lot of information.

Blossom Hill nursery on Almond Blossom in Oakdale is a good source for purchasing native plants for your garden.

'Calscape' website will provide a list of plants native to your exact address.
