Robot named 'Roger'.

It has been 3 years from LEGO kits to a full robot, like roger.

The robotics group is 60 members strong.

They design on CAD before building. Then do the mechanical build. Then the programming team and finally the driving team comes into play. The business and outreach team are always busy on organization and fundraising.

They are currently funded for travel.

The aim is to increase STEM (Science, Tech, Engineering, Math) in Modesto.

They push the outreach-and events to show the robot and the work the team is doing. They are growing the team from all around Modesto. 10 percent of the team is not from Beyer, but from other schools.

Team is currently emphasizing the goals of management and communication.

They have an organizational structure of managers, team captains, students.

Individual student development is very important. Students come in with potentially zero skills in these areas to becoming very capable.

Spreading the word of STEM is important.

They do many sponsor events and visit such as this.

Mentors are involved and always encouraged. 15 currently.

The challenge changes each year. This means they need to re invent the robot for each challenge and year. After all the build and programming and testing the work culminates in a competion at Davis.

This year the focus of the challenge is on handling objects of different materials and firmness. One of the current big difficulties for robots in the wider world is grasping and holding without damaging. This is critical in warehouse and stocking operations with different weight and strength and softness of items. As robots become more involved in human interactions this will

be even more important; robots can easily have huge strength and ensuring they can be gentle is a big issue.

Travel costs for the team are one of the biggest budget items.

This year the world championships are in Houston Texas. Theyhope to send a team and will have to fly the robot and equipment.

Mentors help in all aspects of the organization.

Some teams have a \$250000 budget. One has a multi million dollar workshop. Our chassis is donated by Hogan Manufacturing which helps.

Matthew Stank is a senior at Beyer High School. He has been on the Iron Patriots team all 4 years of high school, he was the Mechanical Captain his Junior year and is the current team co-Captain. As team captain, Matthew manages all 70 students on the team, and is the project manager keeping all of the sub-teams running smoothly. Matthew will be majoring in Mechanical Engineering and has been accepted to UC Berkeley, UC Irvine, and Cal Poly Pomona.

Audrey Rosenow is a junior at Beyer High School. She has been part of the drive team, mechanical team, and business team on the Iron Patriots. She is currently the Business Captain and will be team co-Captain next year. Audrey has been instrumental in planning and executing outreach events, and will be the camp director for the team's summer STEM camp.

Hudson Monday is a junior at Beyer High School and is a programmer on the team. He is currently Programming Captain and will be team co-Captain next year. Hudson has been an asset to the team over the last 3 years, not only contributing to the programming, but working with the other sub-teams to ensure that the robot functions seamlessly.

All three students are top students at Beyer high school, taking the most rigorous course loads offered and maintaining the highest gpa's while also spending countless hours in the robotics shop and attending several community outreach events each month.
