Jewell Kee, administrator for Alzheimer's and Dementia support center.

Jewell took care of her husband from diagnosis to death.

She has lived in Modesto for 70 years.

Jewell met her husband in riverbank at the age of 15 years. Told a girlfriend she would marry him. She was determined and a year later got married.

Six years later, first child. 'How am I going to tell her she needs to get an education and career' Jewell wondered as she remained a high school drop out and wife and mother. She now runs the Alzheimer's group.

It is an all volunteer organization, expect for the bathroom cleaner, that supports the caregivers in the area. Caregiving is a tough job as you watch a person become a non entity.

She started volunteering in 2012. 65 percent of caregivers die before their patient. The organizations main job is to keep those caregivers going.

One day suddenly the regional organization came down and closed the office. 'You don't need a support group in Modesto' They continued though, at the first meeting of the new group everyone had to bring their own chairs. They file papers to become a 501c 3.

Originally they had 89 people in Modesto looking after a patient with a dementing disease. They now have 689 people from Merced to Stockton who they help as a support group. 4 support groups meet at their office on McHenry and they have other support groups in outlying areas.

The state Theater is hosting a meeting to discuss support groups for caregivers.

\$4000 a month is needed for rent and supplies and insurance. They hold one annual fundraiser at the Greek Orthodox Church.

Alzheimer /Demenitia support center is based in Modesto and is operated by concerned Modesto's who are all volunteers.



They meet at 700 McHenry Ave, Monday's, 9:30 to noon. Arrive when you can, leave when you need.

Meetings have tissues on every table as you will either be laughing or crying.

One quick story that Jewell told was when the family came for a day and her husband could not remember the grandchildren or even children's names.
