Buddy Wesson, director of the Junior Navy Seals, gave us an overview of this effort to help teens “not just survive but be successful.” Some of the graduates have gone on to the military, even the highly competitive military academies, but the primary goal is to teach leadership skills and the value of teamwork.

Buddy explained the six leadership areas: Communication, teamwork, situational awareness, goal setting, stress control and etiquette.

Liz Robinson, a nurse at DMC, talked about the positive impact that Junior Navy Seals had on her daughter, Emily. She is now in her third year at the California Maritime Academy, which is part of the Cal State system. Liz said her high-energy daughter was looking for a place to fit in and she found it in the Junior Seals.

The third speaker was Nathaniel Saucedo, an alum of Junior Navy Seals who is now a civil engineering major at Delta College. Nathan shared some of his experiences, including the idea of “setting yourself up for success.”
