ANNOUNCEMENTS:

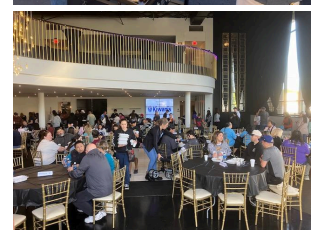

David Harter - sooooo many members who did not sign. There were so many challenges, some successful and some not so successful. But now he is officially apron-free!

PROGRAM: Brian Sanders introduces Debbie Sanders, wife of 31 years, whose day job is a CPA at Grimbleby Coleman and mother to 3 amazing children. She is also a board member for Sierra Vista Child & Family Services.

Over 27 different programs. Debbie has been a member for the last year and a half. She showed us a video that shows us what Sierra Vista does because not a lot of people know. When she joined the board, there was a fairly new CEO named Andrew. It was asked, we've been doing this for 30 years, what do we do now? Main focus is that the child is the client. What services do we offer and what services should we be offering? Where is the gap and how do we fill it? They want to connect quality resources in behavioral health. Goal is to start counseling at a young age to solve the problem from the start. All services are free of charge, or if your insurance covers it. They are always looking for mentors to volunteer their time to help one child. Most of these children have suffered trauma at a young age.

They have a computer lab that allows them to explore and create whatever their heart desires. Kids can express themselves in whichever way they find best. They host a families by buying gifts for underprivileged children so that they have a gift to open on Christmas morning. Vintage Faire Mall is a great supporter of Sierra Vista and what they do. If you are interested in being a mentor, helping the children, and cultivating a lasting change, reach out to her and she will get you in contact with the right people.

Q&A:

Bob D. was involved with Sierra Vista in its infancy as a principal. He says that it is great to see that they have evolved into something so great that it's a one-stop shop for much-needed assistance. They are moving from their Needham location to near Home Depot so that they are able to house more programs in one location.

Allan R.: How is it funded? Mainly through the County, grants, and donations from the public. They host a golf tournament to raise funds. Macy's shuts down their store and donates gift cards to the kids to get whatever it is they feel they want.

Tim R.: How many full-time and part-time staff and where are the locations? All in different places, but admin building will be the one that moves. Always looking for behavioral health clinical psychologists.
