Program: From Learning Quest: Josh Cruz, deputy director, and Michelle Jasper, director of development and communications.



Josh: Students come from all backgrounds and they share some amazing stories. One who started at the 2nd grade level reading; another passed her GED with 10 days of study and testing. She faced losing her job otherwise.

They offer a lot of services beyond helping people learn to read: ESL classes, family literacy, conversation in the workplace, citizenship test prep and child care so parents can attend classes.

Adult Literacy – partnership with the Stanislaus County Library. They'll find a location to offer tutoring while the Modesto library is closed for its major renovation.

Kids Quest is a new and unique program offers assessment and tutoring for children with dyslexia.

Michelle shared several more stories, including a mother who was asking for help because her teen-age daughter was threatening to drop out of high school.

Josh said Learning Quest is getting more requests from people, specifically two groups: English language training for refugees from Afghanistan and GED prep from young people who dropped out of school during COVID and now want to get their GED.

Learning Quest has a major fund-raiser coming up on Oct. 12 "Over the Edge for Learning Quest." Volunteers will collect at least \$1,000 in donations and then rappel down the black building at 1524 McHenry. For those who prefer to watch from the ground, there will be a Sip & Savor event for \$50 per person.
