## **Program**

Our Lieutenant Governor, Charlie Christensen. Not sure if this was the program or the official LG's visit to our club, but Charlie spoke about his recent visit to the Kiwanis international convention in Denver.

Charlie was impressed by the airport!

The house of delegates voted on amendments to bylaws and Kiwanis International positions.

The first amendment was a dues increase from \$52 to \$77 dollars to be paid by clubs for each member KI. It passed 82 to 28.

We also pay \$22 for insurance and \$8 for the magazine, to KI.

Then, our club pays \$58 per member to the CalNevHa district.

That totals \$165

NMK dues are currently \$200 of which \$165 will now go to Kiwanis International and the CalNevHa district. It was already tough to run our clubs administrative side on the remaining dues but with the increase it will make it almost impossible. Thus Charlie proposes increasing dues to \$250 annually. There was a lot of support for this. The actual vote will occur in a couple of weeks, giving time for pro and con arguments.

Our general fund goes toward meeting subsidy, conventions, life memberships, the money raised by events goes to the foundation account for use in our efforts to improve the community.
