We have the October 26 Wine Day in Lodi. The event last Friday was amazing and went well with over 100 guests in attendance.

PROGRAM: John Sanders introducing new member, Andrew Hendricks, as our speaker today and will be talking about the East Area Rapist. Andrew has spent 25 years with the Stockton Police Department. He served the last 15 years as a Sergeant and then became a Detective in the Special Victims Unit.

Joseph DeAngelo, also known as the East Area Rapist. He resided in the Sacramento area, went into the army then got a degree in criminology, becoming a police officer. While he resided in the Visalia area there was a rampage of burglaries and peeping toms. There were over 120 burglaries that we know of. His first murder was a college professor. He tried to take the professor's 16 year old daughter but was stopped by dad, which resulted in being shot and killed. If the professor hadn't caught him in the act, his daughter could've been his first rape. He has admitted to over 50 rapes, starting in Carmichael and then moving over to the East Area of the region.

A lot of crimes are done by people who are able to go to different counties and different areas. No one was able to connect them because they didn't have the technology that we do today. It was mentioned that he only attacks houses where the females are alone cops figured that out, and soon after he started attacking houses with males in them as well. In the 70s houses did not lock doors or closed windows like we do today. He broke into the houses early in the morning as victims were rudely awakened with a flashlight. He asked the women to tie up the men, then took the women into another room and tied her up, then he went back into the room with the man and retied his knots and placed plates on his back. He then went back to rape the women, telling the men that if the plates rattled he'll kill everyone.

At one point he had a random confrontation with an Air Force captain and his wife. They ran from him and he ended up killing the Air Force captain, his second killing. He then moved to Stockton, committed crimes there, then came to Modesto. He committed two rapes in Modesto with the same MO then moved over to the Contra Costa/Alameda Counties and committed roughly 10 rapes. At this point he has become so proficient at committing these crimes, he was hard to catch. He was married to his wife of over 30 years, who was a divorce attorney, and she never had a clue that he was doing all of this.

In 1981, he moved to the LA area in Southern California, and upped his game. He was now doing rapes and murders, roughly 12-15, with increased brutality. He is also started removing evidence unlike before. His last known crime was committed in 1986. In the late 90s, DNA started becoming a thing and were brought into these cases where DNA was present. In the Southern California crimes, there was DNA evidence that was put into databases. In the early 2000s, a criminologist named Paul Huls (?), started cataloging DNA from all these crimes.

Michelle McNamara worked on these cases for 3 years until her death. While working on this she was also working on a book titled, "I'll Be Gone in the Dark". She never finished the book, but her colleagues worked on it and released it a year after her death. This book revived the case and forced the FBI to offer up a \$50,000 reward to revitalize the investigation.
