- Update on Modesto Landmark Preservation Efforts
- He has been a part of the Landmark Commission since August 2021
- A variety of historic buildings were demolished over the years: Southern Pacific Depot, Old Modesto Bank Building, Victorian Courthouse and others
- Modesto has 59 Landmark buildings and homes
- Landmark Commission has been around since 1988
- Recent Business: State Theatre Mills Act Contract; State Theatre has been a landmark since 1995;
- Mills Act allows local jurisdictions to interact with private property owners who own landmark property; allows inspections to be done by city officials to make sure the property owner is maintaining/preserving the landmark.
- Modesto City focuses on the exterior of the building rather than the inside; For example - Modesto High is a Historic Landmark keeping the exterior preserved is

part of the contract. If they wanted they could renovate the interior to modernize it as long as the exterior remained true to its historic look.
