Jim Graham – preliminary numbers: revenue is \$11,000 more than last year. Income from car registrations was up. Total revenue – about \$308,000. Some expenses still coming in, but net could reach \$175,000.

Judy commented on comments that came in via phone and email. 44 packets were unclaimed by people who registered cars. Pat Glattke will have the car show phone while Judy is in NYC – June 19-July 2. She said the no pets rule was proving hard to enforce.
