Program.

Jessica Flores from the City of Modesto oversees the McHenry Mansion and Museum. She holds a Master's in Library and Information Science, was previously a Kiwanian in Southern California, and may rejoin a local club—though not a morning one. Upcoming museum events include the Tuolumne River Woodworkers in September, a large Dia De Muertos celebration with performers, 1880 Play Day and Ice Cream Social, Spooktacular Trick-or-Treat (which drew 800 attendees last year), and a Winter Festival kickoff in November. Unique programs like the stuffed animal sleepover offer children breakfast after their toys spend the night at the mansion.

The museum serves as a repository for Stanislaus County and Modesto, is digitizing its photo collection, and follows federal law and the Indian Graves Act. Staff includes Jessica, intern Levi, and volunteers; more volunteers are welcome. There's also a junior docent program for youth ages 13–20, and plans to repurpose the orange grove for event space.

Audience comments included thanks for Modesto Fire Department's 150th anniversary, kudos to Jessica, and praise for the museum's impressive exhibits.
