Bonnie Anne Baird

FEBRUARY 6, 1936 – JULY 29, 2021

Bonnie Anne Baird passed away peacefully at the age of 85 at her Fort Collins, CO home on July 29, 2021, with her loving husband of 64 years, Roger, by her side.

Bonnie was born on February 6, 1936 in Chaffee, MO to Chester and Audrey (Tanner) Morgan. She was an only child. She married Roger Baird on June 15, 1957 in St. Louis, MO. Between 1957 and 1993 Bonnie and Roger made their home in Chicago Suburbs of Palos Park and Mokena. In 1993, the couple relocated to Fort Collins, where they resided until the time of her passing.

Bonnie worked as a Medical Technologist in Illinois, North Carolina, and Oklahoma, until the birth of her first child in 1959. She stayed home to raise her three children Deborah, Amy, and David then resumed her education and earned her Master's Degree in Health Education. Following that, she worked as a Health Educator at the college level and worked for the Red Cross.

Bonnie was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church in Fort Collins. She proudly served as the President of the League of Women Voters, both in Illinois and Larimer County Colorado. She enjoyed playing team tennis, hiking, gardening, skiing, and a wide range of fitness activities. Bonnie loved to spend time in the outdoors, especially in the mountains. In addition, she and Roger traveled extensively throughout the world. More than anything, Bonnie loved her family. She was a devoted wife and mother. Bonnie had many lifelong friends who will miss her dearly.

Bonnie was preceded in death by her parents, Chester and Audrey Morgan. She is survived by her children, Deborah (John) Alsko, Amy Ehrenberger (Gary Crews), and David (Jerilyn) Baird; grandchildren, Nicole Baird, Taylor (Zach) Gertig, Emily (Matthew) Pearson, and Nikolas Ehrenberger; and great-grandchildren, Avery Pearson, and Ella Pearson.

A Memorial Service will be held on Monday, August 2, 2021 at 11:30am at First Presbyterian Church in Fort Collins, with Pastor Mary Lynn Tobin officiating. PGK Kiwanis Meeting – July 27, 2021 – Proceedings

35 members present

Pres. Elect Bill See, at 9:00 AM, opened the PGK meeting at the Senior Center and led the Pledge of Allegiance. **Wil Stutheit** led PGK members in a prayer. Song leader **Tom Trebon** led members in “Auld Lang Syne” in honor of **Hugh Price** leaving. **See** thanked door monitors and appointed **Allen Green** and **Wil Stutheit** for next week.

See asked if any guests were present. **Lloyd Wilson** was recognized, since he has been absent for so long. Welcome back, Lloyd!

See inquired as to Welfare of Members. **Hal Boyer**, via email, reports that he is dealing with several health problems but hope things will improve shortly. **Nancy Brown** reported that **Steve Armstead** is still battling multiple problems but is hopeful.

Secretary’s report – **Brent Reeves** noted Birthdays and Anniversaries: B’day **Jean Martin (Mike)**, 2 August.

Treas. Report – **Bob Main** expects to receive significant income from Coffee and Donuts.

Committee Reports: **Bill Woody** reported that the Social Committee and volunteers for the Christmas party met and are considering the Marriott and the Fort Collins Country Club as potential venues for the party. A straw poll indicated about 42 spouses and members would attend.

Tom Trebon reported that golf interest continues. Last week the good-time four-some reported “no hits, no runs, few errors” (for a golf group that may be significant). Openings are available for Thurs. at 10 at City Park 9 and Fri. at 10:20. A sign-up sheet was available at the back of the room.

Potential member **Jim Grieve** made a pitch for a possible fund raiser that might be considered, based partially on comments and suggestions from **Ken Tharp**. Basically, the fund raiser would be an Art Auction with donations from those who are now downsizing or have excess items. **Grieve** used several personal examples with the implication that the items for auction (sale) would have significant values (as opposed to “junk”). He anticipates this auction would provide significant income to PGK. A potential venue might be the Art Lab and a potential date might be the Fort Collins “Art Walk” on the first of the month. This idea will be discussed later.

See asked for Good News/Bad News (and donations) – none were offered.

At 9:18 **Fred Schrekinger** introduced **Hugh Price**, who continued his insight into the history of PGK based on his experiences. **Price** illustrated his presentation with a series of many photographs of his volunteer efforts and those of PGK volunteers at various functions over the years, including: his teaching at Rice School, packing school supplies, review of the historical artifacts at the apartment of **Jack Nielsen** (PGK’s major donor) and his history with the Secret Service, annual Veteran’s Day with pancake breakfast, Food Bank volunteers, Back to School volunteers, the support of a library in Afghanistan, participation in the annual St. Patrick’s Day parade, working with Project Smile (including **Jim Goettl’s** psychology to get frightened young folks to be examined), deceased long-time member **Jack Fowler’s** volunteerism at Pizza Parties and the continued enthusiasm of **Kevin O’Connell** and others, the leadership of **Dave Marvin’s** Toy Project, the many hours of VITA volunteers, support of Teaching Tree, **Bob Viscount’s** efforts with Ridge View Classical School, the Garage Sale, **Jeannie Craft’s** Coats & Boots efforts, La Familia, and many more efforts during the last decade (documented and based on when cell phone cameras were widely available).

This presentation was a silent but beautiful testament to **Hugh Price’s** extensive efforts over his years with PGK – he was always there, though not always in the photos, at the service. Hurray and many thanks to Hugh!

See adjourned the meeting at 10:03.

Presentation continued until 10:10 when **See** thanked **Price**.

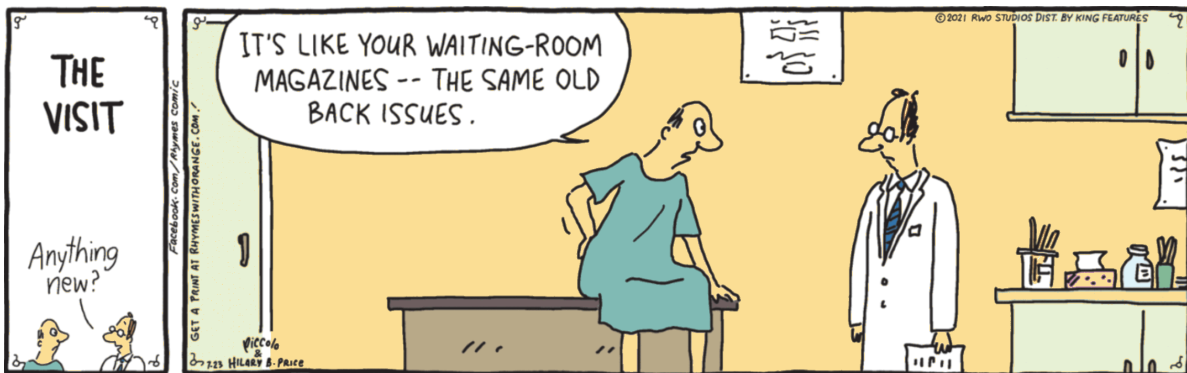
