36 members present (6 on Zoom), 1 guest, and 4 speaker

Pres. See, at 9:00 AM, opened PGK's person-to-person meeting as well as the simulcast Zoom meeting for those not able to attend at the Senior Center and (lacking a real flag, led the Pledge of Allegiance to a virtual flag. **Tom Trebon** led a prayer.

See requested door monitors for next week. Jeannie Craft and Steve Armstead volunteered.

See asked if guests were present: Austin Gunshuls introduced himself and expressed interest in PGK.

See requested status of welfare of members and families: No reports were offered.

See asked for the Secretary's report. Reeves noted a birthday for Bob Main and expressed a hope that a celebratory check is forth coming, and anniversaries for Joan Kurz and Larry Jones, May 6, and Mary Rezetka and Bill Robertson, May 7.

See asked for the Treasurer's report. Bob Main again encouraged selling more donuts and noted several donations in memory of previous President Bill Tosch.

See asked for Committee Reports. Kevin O'Connell, chair of Children and Youth Services Committee, emphasized the requirement for a completed background check for all PGK members who participate in activities that involve kids. The background check is available through KI and cost \$25 for 2 years. Pres. Elect Mark Tobin announced the names of nominees for PGK officers and BOD, noting voting will be in May. Current nominees are: Kevin O'Connell for Pres. Elect, and Lloyd Wilson, Tom Trebon, and Sam Kornfeld for BOD. See reminded members that anyone who is interested in being an officer or on the BOD should contact Tobin and submit their name. Bill Woody (Social Chair) is considering plans for the scheduled June 29 summer picnic.

See asked for any comments regarding Special Events or Announcements. **Trebon** advertised golf, and reported that 4 golfers met at City Park 9 at 10 last Friday, the wind pickup to 45 MPH shortly thereafter, and 3 golfers returned – the 3 are anticipating soon finding the 4th. Golfers are welcomed for Friday at 10 at Southridge. **See** thanked **Tobin** for serving during the last two weeks and reminded members that May is new membership month and members are requested to consider bringing their friend/neighbor as potential new members. **Dave Marvin** is scheduled to review actions and activities of PGK at our meeting mid-May as a preview for potential members.

At 9:15 Jeannie Craft introduced 4 members from Global Leaders, Inc., including Joanne Szuch, who presented, using a PowerPoint presentation and short video, the history and activities of the organization. According to the web site (globalleadersinc.org), the mission is "STUDENTS EMPOWERING STUDENTS" and the organization is "a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that empowers students to become leaders through service locally and abroad. We are proud to call the Fort Collins, CO community our home. Our students develop a lifelong ethic of service by combining a 9-month local service-learning experience with an international service-learning experience." Students have visited Guatemala and have endeavored to enhance the living conditions of the locals. Among the many accomplishments, over 1200 students have been served and over 62,000 local service hours have been logged.

The presentation ended at about 9:42, and Q&A continued until adjournment at 10:00.
