PGK Kiwanis Meeting – September 20, 2022 – Proceedings

30 members present (including 4 on Zoom), 0 guests, and 1 speaker

Pres. See, at 9:00 AM, rang the bell and opened the PGK's person-to-person meeting with the assistance of **Bill Robertson** on Zoom duty. **See** led the Pledge of Allegiance and **Don Edminster** offered the invocation. **See** reminded members to turn off their cell phones

See thanked **Bill Woody**, who miss his duty, as well as 4 volunteer early risers who somehow managed door duty, and then recognized **Steve Armstead** for next week.

See asked if guests were present: None were recognized.

See inquired as to welfare of members. No comments were offered. However, members **Dave Ham, Dave Striffler, Bob Fromme**, and **John McDonough** participated via Zoom.

See requested the Secretary's report. Brent Reeves noted birthdays for Debbie Bridge (Burr), Sept. 22, Ray Betts, Sept. 23, and Dave Ham, Sept. 24, but no anniversaries.

See asked for the Treasurer's report. **Bob Main** reminded members that dues of \$ 151 are due before October 1 to remain in good standing, that he has received dues from about 25% of membership, and is willing to pick up a check at your home from any members needing assistance.

See announced the BOD has suggested dues be increased to \$200/year. Sam Kornfeld announced that a vote by BOD on dues increase will occur next week. Robertson reported that future publication of the Newsletter (25 copies) will cost about \$6 a week. Main reported that dues to Kiwanis International will probably increase and that current dues (\$151 of which PGK keeps \$28) do not cover cost of operations and not even the cost of room rental.

See requested committee reports. **Robertson** reminded members of Food Bank volunteerism and signup for Oct. 3. **Mike Martin** reminded members of upcoming Vet Day Breakfast at the Senior Center scheduled for Nov. 11. **Ham** reported that a drive through for COVID inoculations is available at Front Range Community College and that he will be 94 this birthday. **Fred Schrekinger** chairs the program committee with 4 members and seeks input, suggestions, and ideas from members.

See asked for Special Events/Announcements. Ken Tharp announced that the Committee on Peace seeks to encourage young people to vote, and that he and wife Marty can keep in touch in limited range with walkie talkies. Tom Trebon promoted the Xmas Party (Dec. 14) at Bistro Nautile with miscellaneous comments regarding additional new prizes and encouraged members to donate. Wil Stutheit announced he will be 95 next week and produced a generous check for \$ 100 (\$ 5 more than his age) in anticipation of years of life to come.

See asked for Good News/Bad News. No comments were offered.

At about 9:28 **Bob Viscount** introduced speaker Poudre River Library District Executive Director **Dianne LaPierre** who began her presentation on the goals, organization, and operation of local public libraries. According to the web site, "the Poudre River Public Library District is where the free flow of information cultivates growth and serves as a steady, limitless source of renewal for all of its communities... [and its] shared resources serve more than 207,000 people across a vast 1,800 square-mile region in northern Larimer County, Colorado. The District operates under the laws of the State of Colorado and is governed by a seven-member Board of Trustees...the District is dedicated to matching the diverse community's needs, interests, and priorities with exceptional opportunities for learning, intellectual stimulation, and personal enjoyment. In all its endeavors, the District aims to enrich the cultural, educational, and economic life of the growing regional area which it serves." Q&A began about 9:45.
