Did you miss out on the convention fun this year? Or just want to relive it? Here are just a few highlights from this year's celebration of service and fellowship.

Fun and fellowship everywhere: Whether it was meeting CKI members during a Kiwanis celebration, building Little Free Libraries

for the convention host city or dancing to the music of The Oak Ridge Boys, attendees connected with fellow <u>Kiwanis family</u> volunteers from around the world.

Inspiration abounded: We had the chance to hear from featured speakers, including Emmy Award-winning professional drummer Clint Pulver and Andrew Zimmern of the Travel Channel's "Bizarre Foods," and we got tips and ideas from experts during sessions devoted to volunteer education.


