Club positions:

- President Elect Spends the year learning the ropes of president.
 Becomes president the following year.
- Service Chair Leads the group of service project leads and ensures events are scheduled.
- Webmaster Creates and maintains a new club website and google suite.

Foundation positions:

- President Presides over all meetings of the Foundation board,
 presents Foundation updates to the club, and serves as chief
 executive officer of the corporation
- Vice President Leads meetings in the absence of the President.
 Performs other duties as assigned by the board
- Treasurer Handles and accounts for all Foundation funds, including maintaining financial records.
- Trustees Participate in regular board meetings, responsible for electing new officers, and choosing the nonprofits that we provide grants to each year — this consists of reading through the applications and voting on the nonprofits.

All positions are open, with some people looking for re-election. We would love to get more people, especially younger folks, involved on the Foundation board. All positions will serve from October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024.

 Ultimately, the whole club will need to vote on such a change. Please email the foundation or David Hutton with any questions.


