August 22, 2023 PGK Kiwanis Meeting – Proceedings

27 - members present – including 2 – Zoom; 5-guests + (1-speaker)

President Mark Tobin, rang the bell at 9:03 AM, and opened the PGK's person-to-person meeting with the assistance of **Bill See** on Zoom duty. **Tobin** reminded members to turn off their cell phones led the Pledge of Allegiance and **Don Edminister** gave the invocation. **Tom Trebon** led the PGK to sing "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands."

Tobin thanked **Bill Woody** as door monitor and **Kevin O'Connell** volunteered for next week (August 29).

Tobin asked if any guests were present – Jerry, Sue Ellen, Brian, Marty & Ann

Welfare of Members and Family: No news is good news!

Good News/Bad News: Fred Schrekinger mentioned that West Nile hit his wife. Secretary's report: Stuart Hirai advised the club of a birthday and anniversary today. He also mentioned that Division 3 has a new Lieutenant Governor, Anne Elliott (Broomfield North Metro - Kiwanis). She will have quarterly division council meetings via Zoom (anticipate Nov/Feb/May/Aug). Club presidents and Secretaries are invited to attend (send her your email link if you wish to participate). Dates for Key Leader are 9/22-9/24 at Allen Stewart Lions Camp in Casper, Wyoming, and 10/13-10/15 at the YMCA of the Rockies in Estes Park. The cost is \$50 to attend.

Treasurer's report: Bob Main provided a breakdown of costs for the PGK Kiwanis dues by October 1. Here is the breakdown as Bob presented: KI Dues-\$52, Magazine-\$8, Spouse Magazine-\$0), Insurance-\$17, District-\$28, Remainder for PGK (primarily rental costs at the Senior Center-\$96). Members-\$200 (rounded down to \$200) and Spouses-\$192, the difference of \$8 is for the Spouse's Magazine.

Special Events/Announcements: The annual Christmas party will be held at C.B. Potts Restaurant & Taphouse, located at 1441 East Horsetooth Road on December 14. Costs per person will be determined when the number of participants is nailed down. /Tobin also announced that he and O'Connell will form a committee to select a member for recognition during the past year. Committee reports: Jeannie Craft reported that Respite Care wrote a nice thank you note for the Therapy Garden the PGK funded. **Stephen Andersen** reported the Community Foundation funds increased to \$464K (from \$461K from last year at this time). He would like to have a meeting with his committee on September 5 at 0800 prior to the PGK meeting.

This week's speaker: Professor William Timpson, Ph.D. – "Building World Peace": Ken Tharp introduced Professor Emeritus, School of Education, Colorado State University, who specializes in "Sustainable Peacebuilding." After retiring from CSU in 2020, Professor Timpson has been lecturing about "Teaching and Learning Peace," Restorative Justice and Mediation Services, and numerous other topics; and has written nineteen books. The whole idea of shifting from violence to peace is something Timpson is most enthusiastic about cross-cultural differences and challenges. He is a member of the Rotary Club of Fort Collins, has received a number of grants from the local Rotary, Rotary District, and Rotary International. These grants will allow Timpson to pursue plans to further educate, train personnel, and establish "Peace Centers." He provided a case study of the peace process in Northern Ireland and Belfast which highlighted "specifically diversity, sustainability, peace and reconciliation – that often-divided communities and fomented conflicts."
