AUGUST 22: CYCLING-HIKING MINISTRY of St. Thomas Episcopal Church

Volunteer coordinators, Ian and Cindie Watson joined us to explain the history and purpose of the program. Because Dubois is located near the intersection of two major trails, numerous hikers and cyclists visit our town. The BikeCentennial 4,250 mile route (aka TransAmerica) was established for travel in 1976 to celebrate America's 200th anniversary and takes cyclists through small towns on mostly rural, low-traffic roads. In 1978, the Continental Divide Trail was formally established with the responsibility for management given to the U.S. Forest Service. From 2012 to 2022, the CDT Coalition coordinated efforts among various entities to further construct & maintain the 3,100 mile hiking trail, which stretches from southern New Mexico to northern Montana. Nearly 30 years ago, Lyndie Duff and Deborah McNaughton, members of St. Thomas', developed a plan to provide shelter in a church building for travelers. The program continues to serve hikers and cyclists, providing cots, outdoor picnic space and more. Registration protocols have been established, along with a limit of 8 overnight guests in the Community Room. Organizations, including Kiwanis, often assist in feeding large groups such as Journey of Hope. During the 2022 season, assistance was
