He also mentioned a "Signature Project" initiative suggested by the district. The "Signature Project" is a special activity or event that is easily identifiable to a Kiwanis Club, such as "Project Smile" for the Poudre Golden Kiwanis of Fort Collins.

This week's speaker: Leah Shulz – "Project Smile": Jeannie Craft introduced the speaker as a Dentist from Salud Family Health. Salud has been in Fort Collins since 1970 and remains committed to providing care to the community regardless of finances, insurance coverage, or ability to pay. Their "mission is to provide a quality health, integrated health care home to the community we serve." Salud has 13-clinics and is spread throughout northeastern Colorado with one clinic in southeastern Colorado (Trinidad). They have a mobile unit that provides healthcare to migrant and seasonal farmworkers and refugee populations. Leah provided a .PDF file of her presentation which will be available at the PGK website. Volunteer at McBackpack

If you're looking for an easy hour or so of volunteering a week you may want to consider coming over to First Presbyterian Church (at Mulberry and College Ave) on Mondays at noon. That's where McBackpack does their thing to provide a bag of groceries for food-insecure children throughout Poudre Schools to supplement their families over the weekend.

McBackpack buys the food from the Food Bank, and it takes about an hour a week for volunteers to unload the Food Bank truck, and bag up everything, and then a smaller group of volunteers delivers the bags to various schools around town. The schools are responsible for distributing the bags to the students.

The weekly bag packing event is quite the social gathering, really, with anywhere from 40 to sometimes 70 or 80 people showing up. Plus there are snacks. What more could you ask for?

McBackpack is one of several organizations in town that PGK supports with grants and volunteers.


