History of Empty Bowls

More than two decades ago, the Food Bank for Larimer County's Empty Bowls fundraiser began in art class at Lopez Elementary School when the school's art teacher, Mike McCarthy, inspired his students to create empty bowls to represent those who didn't have enough to eat. Since then, area artists have worked together to support the event and the fight against hunger in the community. Empty Bowls has grown from offering five signature soups in 1998 to more than twenty soups in 2020 and has raised over \$1 million for the Food Bank's hunger-relief programs.


