Valentine's Day








50th Anniversary

Mike McGrath was happy for Barrie Town, who he visited in Florida last week. Barrie is down there laughing at us and our inclement weather.



James Divine

James Divine is half Italian and half American. His mother (Rita) spoke with the letter "A" at the end of each word. He grew up in Norfolk, Virginia. James joined the U.S. Army band at 19 and spent 10 years doing that. He taught music for 25 years, retired and started a band (New Summit Band). He has a 105-year-old saxophone. He has 4 grown kids and 10 grandkids.

Growing up, James could remember the smell of garlic when you opened the door to his home. His mother was a 5 feet tall and weighed 200 lbs. Her secret ingredient in the meatballs was "love".

James's parents were an arranged marriage. His widowed father had already had a family when his parents married. His mother left his father after 5 years of marriage and went back to Italy with her children. In Italy, there was never a lack of food or a place to sleep either on a floor or sofa. Everything was done around the table. With 15 people around the table, their voices were loud and there were emotions coming out. Always plenty of food, espresso coffee with lots of sugar. Of course, most of them had bad teeth.





In an Italian family, the first daughter in every family is named after the grandmother (Nona). For a large, extended family like theirs, there were lots of girls named Angela. James's mother's parents died young. His aunts were young and his uncle played guitar. They lived in Italy for 2 years and during that time, his mother would go to auditions and take her kids with her. When they moved back to the States, his mother with her loud voice joined the church choir. His mother had a wooden spoon to use for "toto" (speak the spank). His mother didn't know the English language very well and at times James would have to interpret for her. America was a "Land of Opportunity." She only had a first-grade education but taught herself to read and write both Italian and English. As the oldest daughter, she took care of her younger siblings. She worked as a cleaning lady and a caterer. In the years growing up, James and his siblings liked to collect buttons especially the Easter button and show them to others.

James grew up with the 4 F's. 1) Faith - Belief in God. 2) Family – Important. 3) Food – Everyone claims to have the best meatballs. 4) Fun.

His 97-year-old Papa Jimmy had 5 piece-a advice for people:

1) Eat – Italian food has no calories. 2) Take no medicine except a chill pill. 3) Must have balance in your life. Work and Fun. 4) Take Olive Oil for your hand and face. 5) Sex, but marriage first.

James dated many women, and his mother always knew that they were not right for him. After 2 1/2 years of dating Susan, he brought her to dinner. His mother knew that she was the one because she asked for seconds of lasagna!
