March 4: Thank God for fleas

Cyndi Dugan shared a story with great impact from one of the many books she reads.

Corrie ten Boom (1892-1983) was a Dutch Watchmaker and survivor of Nazi death camps, being thrown into them with her family after risking their lives to help Jews and underground workers escape during WWII.

The Hiding Place, authored by ten Boom with Elizabeth and John Sherill, is a biography recounting her journey. She tells of her sister Betsie thanking God for the fleas in their barracks at Ravensbrück concentration camp. The reason for her comment came from the fact that once the guards knew of the infestation of fleas, they stopped going in to the barracks, keeping the women safe from assault.

A Bible had been smuggled into the camp and Betsie was reportedly guided by a verse from I Thessalonians: "In every thing give thanks . . ."

The Hiding Place was originally published in 1971 and has since been reprinted in a variety of formats, including a Graphic Novel for young people.

An induction ceremony was held for Peggy Emanuel! Her daughter Erica joined us and we were treated to a recording of the song Peggy's granddaughter sang in the Riverton Kiwanis Stars of Tomorrow competition – a beautiful acapella rendition of the *Hallelujah Chorus*50/50 King Cake prizes won by Cyndi & Erica

March 18: Lori Sincavage - Author

Lori Sincavage joined us to speak about her newest venture. A love of animals fostered during her childhood, coupled with a career of over 30 years as an elementary school teacher (five in Dubois), instilled a desire to write a teachable children's picture book.

After Lori and her husband moved to Dubois, they learned much about the neighboring herd of Bighorn Sheep in the Whiskey Basin area. They also became aware of a herd near Lander that had disappeared because of limited food supply, predators, disease and other factors.

The last Ram to leave the canyon was Bam Bam, and Lori chose him as the topic of her first book, *Bam Bam the Sinks Canyon Ram*. Lori's rhythmic text and wonderful illustrations, inspired by the photography of her husband Bill Sincavage, create a delightful adventure.



While the book's reading age is 3-10, we Kiwanis members thoroughly enjoyed hearing Lori read it during the meeting. The newly published author will continue to take *Bam Bam* to classrooms around the state and find

new ways to get it into the hands of kids at libraries, book stores, schools and homes. The book is available on Amazon and in Dubois at the Bighorn Sheep Center.
