February Recap ~

Feb 4: Will Alexander Dubois Search and Rescue (DSAR)

DSAR covers North & Western Fremont County in conjunction with the Fremont County Sheriff's Dept, Dubois Volunteer Fire Dept, Teton County SAR and Sublette County SAR.

Depending on the scale of the event, the Incident Command System blends first response teams for coordination. Dubois community members with a wide variety of experiences and skills make up the current DSAR roster of 20+ people. About 10-12 are core volunteers, with an average call generally resulting in 1-6 people involved with an incident. Harold Albright serves as Commander and Wes Hust as Vice Commander.

Volunteers are always needed and go through trainings for varying seasons and situations using 4 wheelers, side by sides, snowmobiles, Banana Boat, first aid, communications methods, hiking and tracking. Will explained that training also occurs in CERT programs (Community Emergency Response Team) to educate volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area and to train in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Additionally, DSAR is planning to offer a tracking class in Dubois this summer with Fernando Moreira, a renowned tactical tracking expert.

DSAR relies mostly on donations and grants to obtain necessary equipment and supplies.

Communication systems, drones, personal thermal vision, handheld radios, an enclosed trailer, batteries, generators and more are expensive. Those wanting to donate may do so by adding funds to the jars found at a few Dubois businesses and/or by mail to:

American Cancer Society's Hope Lodge

A Dubois resident for nearly 20 years, John has dealt with 10 years of treatment and is dedicated to helping those from Wyoming find logistical solutions to their challenges of Cancer. While receiving treatments at the Huntsman in Salt Lake City, John and his caregiver were provided a place to stay free of charge at Hope Lodge. The patients make their own meals and join others in a dining area. Currently, the Hope Lodge program offers 1,100 rooms at 31 locations in the U.S. and Puerto Rico for patients during treatment so people with cancer can focus on getting better.

Through it all, John continues to be an active community volunteer. He serves on the Fremont County Library Board, St. Thomas' Episcopal Church Vestry and is treasurer of the Board for Community Health Centers of Central Wyoming, which oversees the Dubois Medical Clinic. John expressed his appreciation to Kiwanis for taking care of people.
