## Service Leadership Program

Mike Luginbuhl told us that the Children's Literacy Center is officially moving from Grace Best to Woodman Valley Chapel sometime in July. They might need some help moving materials. Mike also said the school year is over, but snack packs will continue to be provided through the summer. Snack packs will be assembled at tri lakes cares on Tuesdays from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. and will be distributed from the YMCA. Volunteer sign up is not yet available electronically, so you can just show up at Tri-Lakes Cares to help.

Palmer Ridge High School could use volunteer help on their Outdoor Learning Lab (OLL) on a regular basis. The OLL contains several different areas and gardens, including a pollinator garden, a cover crop demonstration area, an ornamental garden, a Colorado native plant garden, a transect area for year-to-year research, two greenhouses, and raised and elevated garden beds. They will also have a weather station. PRHS carpentry classes built the greenhouses, raised beds, and seating for the OLL. # **Member Bios Frank Wynne and Mike Luginbuhl**

Our speakers today were MHKC members: Frank Wynne and Mike Luginbuhl, who presented their bios, both representing very interesting lives in service to their country.

Frank started the morning with an outline of his life's history, starting in the Bronx NY, and on to Central Florida where he finished school. He also outlined his career in the Army, then focused his time as an Armor officer in the Middle East.

Frank was in Desert Storm and Desert Shield, and showed a number of interesting pictures about, and told stories of, life and action as the commander of an Armored Scout platoon in during the attack of Iraq.

He clearly illustrated the challenges of combat in the desert and what life was like for those who fought it. His stories also reminded this scribe of why I went in the Air Force.

Frank wrapped up with a brief description of meeting his wife in the Army, and of his family, and then promised another presentation of his time in the Army after the war.



Mike followed Frank with a powerpoint showing his start in Alliance, Ohio, in 1954. His memories from growing up centered on wearing glasses from a young age and playing lots of baseball.

Mike went on to the University of Akron and then became a Navy officer through Aviation OCS. He went through jet pilot training and then flew Navy fighters on and off of several different aircraft carriers.

Mike then showed us several videos that dramatically demonstrated the challenges of day and night carrier landings. He also described both older and current aircraft carriers, fully reinforcing this scribe's opinion that carrier aviators have a screw loose!
