If you live in the Tri-Lakes area, take I-25 north to Exit 174 (Tomah Rd).

- Turn left / West crossing the I-25 bridge.
- Take an immediate right onto the frontage road. You should not enter the camp ground.
- At the 2 mile point turn Left at Tomah Road Stoplight and cross the railroad track.
- Take the immediate left onto Bear Dance Drive (headed south).
- Continue straight for 2 miles through the roundabout. You will see the clubhouse on the left.
- Parking is on the north side of the main building.
- Come in the main entrance on the west side. There will be a welcome desk in the foyer.

We started all over again with a bagful of chips with a total drawing worth \$10. Larry Young built up the pot a little bit by pulling out a red chip.






Palmer Lake Historical Society

Diane Kokes is the vice president of the Palmer Lake Historical Society. They were founded by Marion McDowell who was a history loving citizen of Palmer Lake in 1956. They are celebrating their 70th anniversary this coming year. Like many volunteer organizations during COVID the participation of their volunteers was reduced. But within the last two years their membership has grown and they hope it continues. They are

located in the LUCRETIA VAILE MUSEUM (66 LOWER GLENWAY STREET PALMER LAKE). The club was invited to visit - it's free. You can bring your grandchildren, family and friends. It has information about the area - the trains, the ranching, the farming communities. And they also have a gift store so you can buy mugs. They have monthly programs on the third Thursday of the month at the Palmer Lake Town Hall. Their upcoming program is a show on the vintage radio - which is a really fun show.



The Palmer Lake Historical Society was instrumental in getting the star on the Colorado National register. The society nominated the star, completed the research for it, proposed the site and were able to get on the Colorado historic registry. It's beautiful and we all see it during the Christmas holiday and several other times! The town is really proud of the fire department at Palmer Lake because they maintain the star, so they go up there and they cut the brush down and replace the lights.

Diane has been told the Kiwanis Club used to do a calendar. And the club used to come to the Historical Society to get pictures. And then they turned it over to the Historical Society because it was a big project, and they thought it fit their organization better. So, Diane brought calendars for everybody. If you need more you can pick them up at the Museum and they're free.

Next year, Colorado is celebrating its 150th anniversary of its entrance into the Union. It was the 38th state to join the union, and Diane showed a map during the Civil War of the original 17 counties showing El Paso and Pueblo Counties as reservations. But the interesting thing about this map is all those points of interest. There are all places where the volunteers during the Civil War could register. Colorado City Museum has a really nice exhibit about soldiers from Colorado in the Civil War. Colorado is the only state formed 100 years after our nation — that's why we are referred to the Centennial State.



Diane invited us to attend the annual Yule Log Hunt. It's on December 14th at the Palmer Lake Town Hall. And it's a great family event. And if you ever go, you'll probably want to go again. And you don't have to go on the hunt. You can stay in the town hall where they have the fire. They sing Christmas carols, and it's just really a wonderful event, waiting for the finder of the Yule Log. The Yule Log Hunt was started in Lake Placid in 1933 and the tradition was started by Lucretia Vaile. They start the Yule Log Hunt with a trumpet player, and they have kept the tradition, so it's kind of like the movie Groundhog Day. They go into the woods to find the log. After it's found and brought back to the town hall they burn half the Yule Log in the fireplace. And the cool thing about the fireplace is that it is over four feet wide, and it was built for the Yule log. And the fire is only in the fireplace once a year. During the celebration the fireplace really gets going (and we're right next door to the fire department). The meaning of the Yule Log is to welcome in the new year, so it's really about celebrating. Diane hopes we will all join the event this year.
