Program: Cheryl Boss introduced Clyde Chapman who talked about his Foster Care Family. Clyde has 8 children, 5 biological children & 3 foster children. They range in age from 23 to 20 months old. What is foster care? It is a temporary arrangement where children are placed in a licensed home with foster parents when the biological parents are unable to care for them due to various reasons like abuse, neglect, or substance abuse. The primary goal is to provide a safe & stable environment while working toward reuniting the child with his family or finding a permanent placement like adoption. The focus is to get the children back to their family. Rehabilitation is involved in becoming better parents. Clyde & his wife, Amber, help the children maintain a relationship with their parents, also involving forgiveness. The key goal of foster care is to ensure the children are living in a stable lifelong family. Just because children turn 18, it's not over. By law, the children are to maintain contact with their parents & siblings. Even if they lose rights with their parents, they still maintain sibling contact. Clyde wants to make sure his children forgive their parents.

The Chapmans do foster care because they love people and love God. They want to give kids the opportunity to be successful, have food, have a vacation, and see 2 loving parents. Foster care is not for everyone. There are opportunities for us – being a CASA worker, help with the foster kids, mentor. There are over 3500 children in Macon County who need a home.
