Program: Andrew Taylor - Economic Development Officer for Decatur & Macon County

Topic - Providing existing and potential area businesses with the information they need to grow and

prosper.

The EDC is a 501c3 organization with a mission of improving the economy of the area. One goal is attracting businesses to Decatur. They reach out to, and discuss businesses that might be interested in locating here. About 1 out of 20 businesses they work with turns into a true prospect.

They also work on retention - encouraging businesses to stay in Decatur. They helped convince Mueller to not only stay but to also build a new foundry facility. 80% of employment opportunities here come from existing businesses.

Recently they applied for and received a \$51 million grant for a Bio Fermentation facility. This facility would help businesses to move from small to medium scale production.

A third goal is community development. Decatur has 2,200 unfilled positions. There are 49,000 people employed here. Of the 11,000, 22% are employed in manufacturing. Many come from other communities.

There is a housing issue problem attracting more people from coming here. 92% of rentals were built before 1980, 42% before 1940. They are working on developing attractive housing for young professionals downtown. They prefer modern rentals with amenities. By providing such housing, we could add more residents, which could attract more businesses.

Decatur's location makes it a good site for distribution. Our railyard is more efficient than Chicago. There are 100 million people within 500 miles of Decatur.
