Program: Ralph Czerwinski introduced Denise Myers, retired Professor, School of Theatre & Dance at Millikin University. Denise thanked us for being producers of the Children's Plays. This gives Millikin students the opportunity to work with children's theatre and can set up careers for the students. This year's play uses some sign language and has 16 actors, 3 writers, 3 musicians, director, stage manager, and a choreographer. There is tap dancing, jazz, & ballet in the show. They started with no scripts and are using gecko & mosquito masks. Students made these masks & others used in the show. Millikin students developed the script. In the show, a young girl wants to be a rock star & doesn't know how. The gecko & mosquito help her. The young girl learns that harmony brings people together through song. Masks can be scary, so the actors show their masks before the show to the audience & at the end take them off. The children in the audience get their own small mask to color & wear during the play & take home.

The play is 45 minutes long & is a musical extravaganza. With improvisation, 90% is thrown out & 10% is kept. Dates: Sat, March 29, 10am, and Sun, March 30, 2pm. \$5 child, \$10 adult.
