Program: Jerry Pelz introduced Regan Deering, Representative IL 88th District. Regan is also on the Mt. Zion School Board. She didn't expect to have a career in politics and has been a community advocate. She follows in Dan Calkins' footsteps. Every 10 years after completing the census, the maps are redrawn, and each district has about 108,000 constituents. It's been an exciting first months. She has learned a lot these first few weeks. Regan travels throughout the district & is passionate about people knowing their officials. She visits many small towns & villages. They are always looking for funding for infrastructure, water/sewer projects, roads, & volunteer fire departments upgrades.

Last week 400 bills were read Monday through Friday at the Capitol. So, it's a lot coming at you really fast! She's been assigned to 6 committees and actually reads the bills. Today from 4-6pm there is an open house at her district office, 419 Ash Ave. She has an assigned seat in the chamber & you can always watch live on ILGA.gov. Several bills of interest to us right now include the Home School Act

which has resulted in many responses & demonstrations. This bill was held to work on. Another bill is eliminating figures of the Native American name or logo & mascot. It would be a large expense to schools. Regan had 2 bills that passed out of committee. One involves a commemorative date in the 1st week of March and the other supports opportunities in STEM (science, technology, engineering, & math). She had one constituent driven bill that went to a sub committee where it dies. Regan will continue advocating for her 3 issues, education, agriculture, & small business. Committees she's on are Energy & Environments, Townships & Counties, Transportation & Vehicle Safety, & Appropriations for General Services.

The House has 78 Democrats and 40 Republicans. She has a district office and a Springfield office at the Capitol. In Springfield, the leadership in both parties assign offices & other staff. In the district office she can hire staff. Taxpayer dollars fund their district allotment - \$179,000 a year. That is to take care of rent, budget, staff, any communications (mailer, flyer). They are interviewing for a paid summer intern. Know of anyone interested? 8 weeks, 35 hours a week, \$15.50 an hour, no age limit. RepDeering.com is her website.
