<u>Program:</u> John Baird introduced Mary Rogers, Program Director at HSHS St. John's Children's Hospital Foundation in Springfield. Brittany Hendricks and son, Jase, also spoke.

Children's Miracle Network Introduction & Hospital Overview

- HSHS St. John's Children's Hospital partnered with Children's Miracle Network (CMN) since 1988.
- CMN is the largest fundraising network for children's hospitals, partnering with organizations like Walmart, Panda Express, Loves Travel Stops, and Kiwanis.
- Annual Radiothon fundraising event scheduled for November 20-21 on Springfield radio stations.
- Hospital treats over **30,000** pediatric patients and families annually, offering trauma, intensive care, surgery, sedation, rehabilitation, neonatal care, and child life services.

• Serves pediatric outpatients from **39 counties**, including specialized services like sleep center and pediatric rehabilitation.

Jase Hendricks' Recovery Story and Impact of Hospital Services

- Jase and his sister involved in car accident on August 10, 2022, T-boned by semi, near home.
- Jase sustained traumatic brain injuries, multiple brain bleeds, broken jaw, 7-8 broken ribs, spleen laceration.
- Treated at St. John's Children's Miracle Network pediatric trauma unit; airlifted from Rochester.
- Spent 5 weeks in PICU, 15 days in coma, ventilator support, jaw surgery with plates and screws.
- Underwent inpatient rehab in St. Louis, relearned basic functions, continued therapy in Springfield children's rehab facility.

Paula Luckenbill - Paula needs at least 10 people to help with "Caps & Lids" Sorting with Millikin students on Thursday, August 21st. 9:30 – noon. Place: Scovill Zoo (big room on the left). There will be 2-3 MU students at each table getting the opportunity to help with a Service Project in Decatur. Everyone should turn in their "Unsorted Caps & Lids" before August 21st, so we have plenty to sort. We need a variety not just medicine bottle lids. Students will arrive at the Zoo between 9:45 and 10:00 and leave at noon.

The purpose of this is to give the students an opportunity to help with a community service project in Decatur. Millikin has asked that we talk about the *9/11 Memorial Project*, the *Ronald McDonald*

House Flip Tab Project, and the "Lids to Benches" program. As you are at the table with the students, please talk about the importance of volunteering and pay it forward in ways that you can. Encourage them to get involved when and where they can. Share what you do to volunteer and why you do it. Talk about the good things in Decatur.

Ask them where they are from, why they came to MU, and what they are studying.

- 9/11 Memorial plants all planted. Getting rock & landscape fabric down before 9/11, Fall flowers planted, and hopefully a plaque for the big boulder in front of the flagpole. The ceremony is 9/11, 6pm, all are welcome.
- Flip tabs took 198.6 lbs. (224,021 tabs) to Springfield to Ronald McDonald House on Aug 2. Since Aug. 2021 she has taken over 571.2 lbs. (644,314 flip tabs)!
- Last week she picked up 2 benches. Will go again on Aug 25. So far, she's secured 36 benches, 22 bird baths, 8 planters. That is 9,238 lbs. kept out of the landfill.
