<u>Program:</u> John Baird introduced Quay Owens, Director of Community & Athletics Ministries, Decatur Salvation Army.

- Quay had 5 years teaching experience at DPS-61, witnessed student struggles (hunger, lack of support, academic challenges).
- Majority of students not reading at grade level; identified as a significant community concern.
- After-school and summer programs initiated at Salvation Army since March, focusing on faith-based curriculum, character development, and educational enrichment.
- Emphasized need for mentors, sponsors, funding, and community involvement to support youth.
- Stressed that youth are resilient but require community support to thrive; called for action over discussion.

Kevin Breheny and Brian Byers were introduced & spoke about the upcoming WSOY Food Drive on Oct 3 at Kroger on route 36.

WSOY Food Drive: History, Impact, and Urgent Needs

- WSOI community food drive marked 25th year; raised **23 million pounds** of food since inception.
- Hiatus occurred 3 years ago; program revived last year, raising \$800,000 in 12 hours for 23 food pantries.
- Current need exceeds last year's funds due to rising costs and demand; 44% of Macon
 County classified as poverty or ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) families.
- Food banks face reduced purchasing power and higher prices; USDA cut \$1.2 million from Illinois Eats Program, impacting healthy food supply.
- Event scheduled for October 3rd at Kroger on US 36; donations accepted via website, Venmo, instore round-up, and pre-bagged food purchases; volunteer opportunities available through United Way.

Community Partnerships & Fundraising Logistics

- Hunger in the community directly impacts children's learning and overall well-being.
- Increasing numbers of young children and senior citizens face food insecurity.
- Food drive has operated for 22 years, expanding due to community support in Macon County.
- Food drive supplies local pantries, directly benefiting vulnerable populations.
- No specific donation request; all contributions are voluntary and impactful.

Volunteer Opportunities & How to Support

- All funds raised on October 3rd go directly to food purchases; no administrative expenses.
- Community partners fund school awards; businesses cover all other costs.
- United Way and Community Foundation manage tax-deductible gifts and distribution.
- Sponsorships start at \$1,000; over 20 sponsors secured, ranging \$1,000–\$20,000.
- Toolkit for fundraising available at WSOYFoodDrive.com; event ends October 3rd, 6 PM.

- WSOYFoodDrive organization focuses on supporting children.
