Title: "Decatur's Not-So Grand Base Ball Tournament of the Western States - - - September 1867"

Baseball came to Decatur after the end of the Civil War. There was national baseball fever from 1865 to 1870. William Johns learned about New York style baseball at the University of Michigan. In 1866, he laid out a baseball field at the intersection of two railroads in Decatur. Baseball was a club sport and games were social events. In Decatur, the MacPherson baseball club was formed. The club was not known for its skill level. One game was stopped early when the club was losing 56-20.

The MacPherson club decided to hold the Grand Baseball Tournament of the Western States in 1867. 80 teams were invited. Eight teams attended. The tournament was held in Fairview Park at the ball field near where there is still one today. Base ball was a gentleman's sport, and decorum was very important. Players were asked if they believed they were safe or out on close plays. They did not use protective equipment and used hard balls. Therefore, fielding was very difficult, and scores were high.

There were some strong rivalries. No one wanted to play the Chicago Excelsiors, because they were arrogant. They were declared ineligible to play in the tournament, because their train was late. Bloomington and Springfield were supposed to play, but didn't because one of the players was disqualified. Springfield players left. Pana agreed to play Bloomington. Pana was ahead and Bloomington blamed the umpire and refused to obey his calls. The ump ended the game early declaring Pana the winner.

Muffin games were played by teams of players with limited skills. They were intended to be humorous. There was a muffin game at the end of the tournament. Descriptions of the game included reporting a player failed to catch a ball, because he was sleeping. The MacPherson team was disbanded at the end of the season.

### **Special Presentation - Honorary Member**

Tom McQuistion and Ralph Czerwinski read a Presentation Letter and presented Professor Emeritus Denise Myers with a plaque naming her an Honorary Member of the Golden K Kiwanis Club, Decatur. Dr. Myers has been affiliated with the Millikin's Theatre and Dance Department for 30 years. She has directed the Millikin University Theatre and Dance Department's "Children's Play" for 13 years. Golden K Kiwanis Club produces the play as a fundraiser and a way to involve Millikin students as well as, provide a quality Children's Play for the children and their families in our community.

We are very grateful to Professor Myers for taking this project and are happy to welcome her as a new Honorary Member of the Golden K Kiwanis Club.
