Topic- Women's Ice Hockey Team in Decatur

Kate Williston, Decatur Women's Hockey Association, said the women's hockey team is called the "Decatur Fury." They are registered with USA Hockey and belong to the Amateur Hockey Association. The hockey players pay \$250 per season and buy their own equipment. Kate displayed and explained all the pieces of equipment the women wear and use. Sponsorships help some players with expenses. They practice on Sundays at 7:45am. It can be hard to schedule rink time at the Civic Center. They play many games out of town. They also participate in charity tournaments. The hockey season runs from September to March.

The DWHA began in 2019 when hockey moms decided to show their children how to play instead of telling them how to play. The first team had 15 players. They could not play on 2020 due to Covid, but practiced and did scrimmages. In 2021, people were ready to try new activities and the team grew to 24 members. The Professional Women's Hockey Association was formed in 2023, which increased interest in the

sport. Since then, the team has had 30-40 players. Kate showed some pictures of some of the team members and talked a little about them.

There is a board consisting of 5 members of the team who serve for 2 years. Kate is the hockey director, and Marketing and PR chair. She has been involved in sports since she was a child, especially soccer and lacrosse. When she moved to Decatur, she began doing roller derby, then added hockey during the off season. Since the pandemic, she has been very involved in hockey.
