

2025-26 INTERCLUB POLICY

The following rules apply for 2025-26.

- 1. Interclub visits are fun and informative and can lead to enduring friendships. They also give you an opportunity to see what other Clubs are doing, allowing you to adopt those activities that can benefit your Club. Kiwanis International encourages Clubs close to newly chartered Clubs to assist the new Clubs in learning how to conduct business the "Kiwanis Way." The following rules apply for 2025-26.
- 2. There will be a point system for an interclub. The point system only applies to visits to other Kiwanis Clubs. The points are based on the

following:

- One member interclub is one point
- Two member interclub is three points
- Three or more member
- interclub is five points
- 3. Clubs will receive a banner patch for the following:
 - Patches will be given to the top 10 Clubs who earned the most points.
 - Patches will be given to the top 10 Clubs who have the most visits.
 - Patches will be given to the top 10 Clubs who have the highest miles travelled.
 - Attendance to a SLP, Training Conference, Division Rally, and Conventions do count for visits and miles traveled; however, they do not count for points and the mileage to the International Convention does not count.
- 4. Clubs will receive a banner patch IF they complete the Interclub Challenge. The Interclub Challenge requirements are that a Club must make a minimum of eight interclub visits to eight different Kiwanis clubs. This applies to Kiwanis Clubs only.
- 5. Remember to report all interclub visits for the point system (see #2) on the attached interclub report form. We recommend that the form be submitted monthly by the 10th of each month. Overall, the form must be submitted by October 10, 2026. All other interclub information is to be submitted by the club secretary on the club's monthly report.

NOMINEES FOR VICE-GOVERNOR

If you or if you know someone who is interested or wants to eventually be Governor of the Georgia District, the process is as outlined below.

Each district officer shall be an active member in a club of the district. The Governor, Governor-elect, and Vice-Governor shall each have completed a full term as a Lieutenant Governor in the District and a full term as a District Committee Chair of the District. The Governor, Governor-elect, Vice-Governor, and District Executive Director shall have and maintain a clear criminal history background check conducted and verified by Kiwanis International.

Each district officer has the duty and responsibility to:

- a. Promote the Objects of Kiwanis International.
- b. Promote the interests of the clubs within the district.
- c. Perform such duties and responsibilities as are currently prescribed or as may be amended in the bylaws, policies, or procedures of Kiwanis International or of the district or as may be assigned by the District Board.
- d. Actively promote implementation of growth efforts of the district in conjunction with Kiwanis International's strategic growth plan.
- e. Actively promote and support programs of emphasis by Kiwanis International, such as the service leadership programs (where applicable) and the global campaign for children.
- f. Attend all meetings required by the district.
- g. Whenever possible, all district officers are encouraged to attend the Kiwanis International Convention.

The District Bylaws for the Georgia District of Kiwanis International,

Article VII, Section 3 states:
b. All qualified candidates for Vice-Governor, Governor-elect and Governor must submit written notice of candidacy to the District Executive Director no later than the beginning of the first convention session.
c. Qualified candidates for Governor, Governor-elect, and

• Submit a signed agreement to Kiwanis International to fulfill the duties of office.

Vice-Governor shall:

- Submit a signed District Statement of Commitment to the district.
- Have a clear criminal history background check conducted and verified by Kiwanis International and submit a signed document to the district certifying it.

• Submit a letter of nomination from the candidate's club.

Don't delay. Please get your letter of recommendation in soon. It will be a process that will require, in all probability your club having voted to endorse one or more candidates from your club, filing that with the Executive Director's office in Albany, having it screened and approved by the District Screening and Nomination Committee, and then finally the delegates will elect the 2026-27 Vice-Governor at the Georgia District Convention, August 2026 in Peachtree City, Georgia. The elected Vice-Governor will afterwards automatically step up each year to Governor-Elect and Governor.

MEMBER RECOGNITION (no more than one per category)

Membership and education – Presented to the member who best exemplifies excellence in growing the club. This includes encouragement of members to invite new people and to work toward building a stronger membership by recruiting at least one new member.

Community Impact – Presented to the member who best exemplifies excellence in service to the community. This is accomplished by participating in at least two club projects through the club's signature project, service programs, and/or the club's sponsored Service Leadership Programs.

Kiwanis Image – Presented to the member who best exemplifies excellence in promoting Kiwanis in the community, strengthening the Kiwanis brand, and/or making Kiwanis known as the organization that most supports children. The image is demonstrated through knowledge gained in attending at least two of the various District training opportunities that are provided at Fall Training, Mid-Year Training, Kiwanis International Convention, Georgia District Convention, and CLE training within your Division. This image would also require the member to attend at least two interclub visits.

Financial Viability – Presented to the member who best exemplifies excellence in supporting Kiwanis fundraising, leading by example as an individual donor and/or demonstrating strong stewardship of the club's resources. Also, by encouraging the club's participation in the annual Georgia District Projects, which support the needs of the children of Georgia and the world, and the annual Georgia District Raffle.
