

KPTI KITS AVAILABLE!



As an advocate for YOUNG CHILDREN I am writing to remind you that materials are currently available from the KIWANIS PEDIATRIC TRAUMA INSTITUTE (KPTI) at Tufts Medical Center in Boston. You may have heard that Tufts Children's Hospital has ended its trauma

services. This is true BUT the Kiwanis Foundation of New England's trauma prevention and community education programs continue this year.

Tufts' administrators indicated that the programs offered through KPTI are valuable and necessary so a contract has been signed to continue services from KPTI through September 30, 2025 and possibly longer. The Early Childhood Injury Prevention Kits, Bike Rodeo materials, Cubby Bears, Bike Helmet program, First Aid Chart and other printed educational materials are available to Kiwanis Clubs in our District.

Research will also continue at Tufts with grant money from KFNE (Kiwanis Foundation of New England). Your Club may continue to order materials without interruption. And I encourage your Club to continue its Annual Gift (of \$12 per member) to KFNE. The Early Children Injury Prevention kits are an excellent hands on service project for your club members. Provided with the materials are plastic bags to pack the materials in assembly line fashion. There is no cost to your club to request these materials.

Hooksett Kiwanis was one of the proud sponsors for the Hooksett Winter Carnival on 1-25-25. While the weather started out cold at approx. 10 degrees, in a short time not only was the weather warming up but so too were the activities and attendance. There were close to 1,000 who attended this event which started in 2018. Outside activities included Snow Shoeing and other outside activities. Also, outside there was fresh cooked popcorn and roasting of marshmallows and making s'mores. Inside there were over 60 arts and craft vendors and Dance School performers as well as food vendors. There was a

raffle with over 100 prizes which totaled more than \$5,000.



CARIBOU GETS MICRO GRANT!

Caribou Kiwanis Club School Snack/Backpack Program was awarded a \$1,000 microgrant through Kiwanis Children's Fund.

This is the third year our club has been doing this

project, and we plan to continue with it. It initially started by adopting an 8th grade class and providing healthy snacks for students who were hungry between meals. We quickly learned that there were many more students in other classes who were also in need, not only for snacks, but meals at home. We collaborated with the school social worker (SSW) who identifies children with food insecurity at home. The SSW provides us with a list of food items that are individually packaged, that only require a microwave to warm up, do not need preparation, and something they can do themselves. We then go shopping for those items

and deliver them to the school.

On Friday's the SSW puts food items in a backpack and places the backpack in the student's locker between classes when other students are not present. The students then return the backpack on Monday to be filled again on Friday. Parental consent is obtained for their child receiving a backpack. We are currently providing meals for 30-40 students on a weekly basis, as well as snacks at school. The SSW contacts the Caribou Kiwanis Club when more food is needed (approximately every 6 – 8 weeks). The SSW also gives our club a list of requested snack items that students can request during the school day if they are hungry. The Caribou Kiwanis Club will continue to raise money through our fund-raising activities to support this need. Snack items consist of microwave popcorn, trail mix, fruit cups, applesauce, granola bars, etc. Backpack food items consist of Mac & cheese, Dinty Moore meals, Raman Noodles, etc.
